# APPEALS TO LANDLORDS TO . **PLAY FAIR**

AUSTIN, Tex., June 23 (UP)-Gov. Beauford Jester, appealing "to the fairness of Texas land-lords," today signed into law statewide rent decontrol for Tex-

"As I sign this bill," the gov-ernor said, "I appeal to the fair-ness of Texas landlords."

Signing of the bill marked the last state hurdle in decontrolling rents in Texas. However, before the law can be

come finally effective, it must first be certified by Tighe E. Woods, national housing expediter.

Barring an attempted block by Washington, rent decontrol would become final in Texas 105 days after adjournment of the Legisla-

Under the federal law, the national housing expediter is required, if the law conforms with control on the 15th day after state act takes effect.

The effective date of Texas' deontrol law would come 90 days M. and 8:00 P. M. each day of the after adjournment of the legisla-
