DALLAS, Tex., June 22 (UP)—The pretty auburn-haired wife of an air force soldier testified in an abortion trial of Mrs. Eva Hodges yesterday that she paid the defendant \$50 for an abortion in April of last year.

## 24 BODIES RECOVERED FROM PLANE WRECKAGE

HARI, Italy, June 23 (UP)—A four-engine Dutch Air Liner flying from the East Indies to Amsterdam, plunged in flames into Bari Harbor today, and at least 24 persons were killed. It was believed 27 were aboard.  
Port authorities feared still more bodies were in the fuselage which was on the bottom of the harbor under 40 feet of water.  
Marine officials reported the recovery of the bodies of 16 men, five women and three children. They were mutilated and charred. Harbor boats darted through the choppy waves some 1,500 feet from the main pier of this port which is on the heel of the Italian boot, and picked up bodies thrown clear of the big plane when it plunged into the sea.  
The KLM liner, nearing its destination after a flight from the

other side of the world, inexplicably burst into flames over the harbor. Witnesses said it fell apart, with wings and tail section breaking away and leaving the fuselage to drop as a deadweight.  
Documents recovered from the water showed that the big ship left the Dutch East Indies Tuesday. It last touched ground at Athens, from where it took off this morning.  
Belching smoke and flame, it plunged into the sea in full view of thousands of persons on the waterfront promenade which stretches for miles along the sea, and is a busy thoroughfare.  
Rough, running seas badly hampered salvage operations. Officials said it might be several days before the flame-scarred fuselage could be brought to the surface. Officials reported that they

## ALL ESCAPE IN CRASH LANDING OF AIRLINER

MEMPHIS, Tenn., June 23 (UP)—A pilot with an iron hand and a precision brain teamed with a quick-thinking, fast-acting young stewardess to save the lives of all 44 persons aboard an American Airlines plane which went down in flames here, grateful survivors said today.  
Capt. Ed Hatch of Memphis and Miss Yvonne Hanavan of Lindsey, Calif., were the heroes in the flaming crash-landing yesterday of the two-engined Convair transport.  
Not a life was lost. Of the 41 passengers, including an infant in arms, and three crew members aboard, 37 were injured. Seventeen were treated and released immediately. Seven were not hurt. Only 20 were hurt seriously enough to remain in hospitals today, and doctors believed all the injured would recover.  
Survivors and eye-witnesses said the saving of the lives was strictly a team job between the calm, skillful Hatch and the efficient Miss Hanavan.  
Hatch brought the burning plane to an amazing crash landing on

the edge of a pea patch smoothly enough to keep his crew and passengers alive. Miss Hanavan took over from there and organized the speedy removal of the passengers before the whole plane could burst into flames or explode.  
The pilot's part in the dramatic action took only 90 action-packed seconds in which it seemed all the odds were stacked against him and his human cargo.  
The big airliner took off at 1:10 P. M. on the Memphis-Nashville leg of a flight from Fort Worth, Tex., to New York. A minute and a half later the passengers were crawling from the wrecked, smoking ship.  
Hatch said the plane was barely airborne when he saw open engine had quit and was smoking. He knew he had to crash-land, and he had about a minute to do it.  
Mechanically, he picked a clear spot about the size of a football field lined with trees on the left and a row of partly-built houses on the right and blocked by a high-tension wire on the near end.

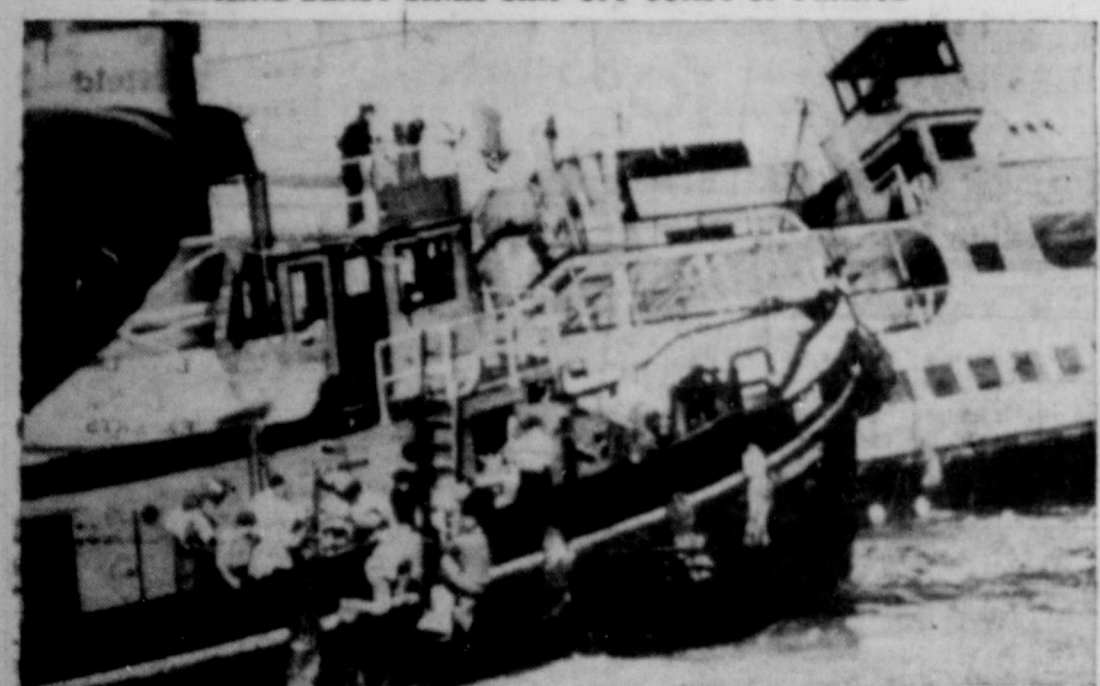
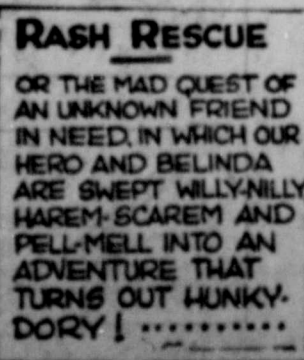

## RUSSIA TURNS DOWN OFFER OF RAIL WORKERS TO MOVE FREIGHT

BERLIN, June 23 (UP)—Russia refused today to move supply trains from Western Germany into Western Berlin despite an offer by railway strikers to handle them.

Emergency crews of 80 striking technicians reported for work at switches, railway yards and other struck installations in Western Berlin to handle trains from the West, but the lines remained idle.

The Soviet-bossed railway administration said the strikers' offer was "an encroachment of the operation rights of the railway."  
The statement was taken to mean that Russia, which controls the railway serving Berlin under a Four-Power agreement, has no intention of permitting trains from West Germany to enter Berlin until the strike as a whole ends.

Altogether 15,000 non-Communist Western Berlin railway workers are on strike. Their 34-day-old workout not only has given the Russians an excuse to reimpose their railway blockade on Berlin, but has halted a 1 1/2 service on Berlin's elevated railroads.
