FORT WORTH, Tex., June 30 (UP)—The president of the American Bar Association charged today that the nation's schools and failed to inspire "proper love for the American way of life in our young people."

Frank E. Holman of Seattle, Wash, levelled the sweeping ac-susation in an address to the ate convention of the Texas Bar

Holman declared that many young people of today fall prey to Communism's ideological promises because they lack the intel-lectual and moral discipline" that comes from work in history, science, mathematics, and litera-

Teaching of American history so ignored in many of the sclools of the country, Holman id, that state legislatures are ng laws requiring it be

Missouri passed such a law, he said, but schools experienced dificulty in complying because teachof history to teach the subject.
