

Solon McCarthy Continues Grows But Watches Law

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., May 15, (UP)—Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy, R., Wis., charged today that a "Lattimore-Acheson Axis" plans to deliver Asia and the Pacific to the Communists, while pretending to fight Communism.

"It is a clever, evil thing to behold," McCarthy told the Diamond Jubilee meeting of the Sons of the American Revolution. "It is gigantic in its fraud and complete in its deceit."

The speech, which McCarthy billed in advance as "the roughest yet" in his campaign against the state department, was a slabbing

attack upon Secretary of State Dean Acheson and John Hopkins Professor Owen Lattimore. But he did not repeat his charge that Lattimore is the "top" Soviet spy in this country.

McCarthy said the Pacific-Asia "plan," which he termed a "vicious hoax and fraud," was "masterminded" by Lattimore. He said it will "wreck nations and enslave millions" while deceiving and betraying America.

"It is the strategy of the Lattimore-Acheson axis of hitting Communists at the front door with a silk handkerchief while they beat the brains out of your friends at the back door," he said.

The speech, broadcast over the National Broadcasting Co. network ignored state department denials—corroborated by three former secretaries of state—that Lattimore has been influential in formulating American foreign policy. McCarthy insisted, that the Professor is Acheson's "principal architect" of foreign policy.

McCarthy said that Lattimore has, in effect, admitted that he is the mastermind of the alleged

Turkish Democrats Claim Big Victory In Parliament Vote

ANKARA, Turkey, May 15 (UP)—The Turkish Democratic party claimed an overwhelming victory today in the general election of 487 members of Parliament.

President Kemal Attaturk's republic People's Party was trailing in the contest for control of the one-house parliament. The party, founded by Kemal Attaturk in 1923, long had held firm control over the house.

Official returns gave the democrats 24,116 votes to the prp's 199,874.

A democratic party spokesman said the official count was far behind the unofficial tabulation which showed his party to have an overwhelming lead. He said the official returns were misleading because most of them were from prp strongholds.

"This gentleman, is the plan conceived by Mr. Acheson's architect, Mr. Lattimore. Conceived and publicly advocated by him for part of the Pacific Area," McCarthy said. "Mr. Acheson has borne it and applied it to the entire Far East."

He said the details of the "Pacific plan of the Lattimore-Acheson axis" already have been put into effect. He cited the failure of the U. S. government to supply aid to Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek's anti-Communist forces on Formosa.
