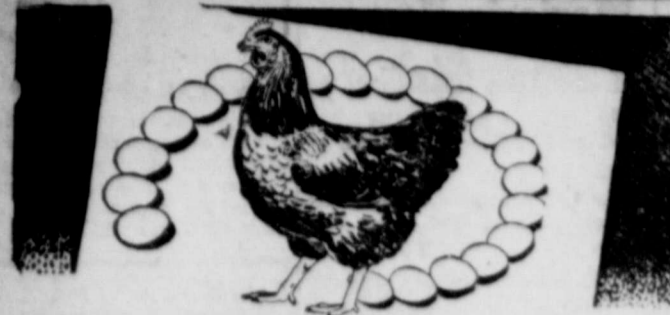

### Big Corps To Pay Quite A Bit More Tax

WASHINGTON (UP)—Unless there's a sudden change of plans, big and medium-sized corporations are going to pay quite a bit more tax money pretty soon.

Take General Motors, for example. As one of the largest and most profitable corporations in the country, it would be one of the business concerns to pay the most under the new tax bill now well advanced in Congress. Here is how it would be affected:

Last year General Motors' net profit, before taxes, was about \$1,125,000,000. It paid the federal government around \$425,000,000 in corporation income taxes.

If the new bill becomes law, and General Motors earnings for this year are the same as last, its taxes will be some \$25,000,000 more.

This is enough money to build two plants the size of a new \$12,000,000 Frigidaire manufacturing and storage plant recently put up by GM near Dayton, O.

While General Motors and 20,000 other companies would pay more, smaller corporations would get a break. They would get a tax reduction.

A corporation which earns \$10,000 a year, for instance, now pays a \$2,200 income tax. The new bill would make the tax \$2,100—a \$100 saving.

A corporation which earns \$100,000 a year pays \$38,000 a year now and would pay \$36,000. As it works out, corporations which make less than \$166,666 would get a break. Those earning more would pay higher taxes.

The 20,000 companies which would pay higher taxes are estimated to produce 70 per cent of the country's goods and services.

The tax reduction would apply to 60,000 corporations that make between \$5,000 and \$166,666 a
