

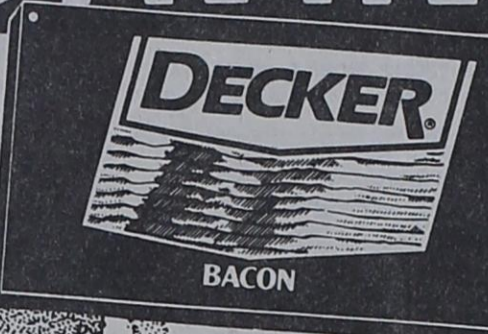
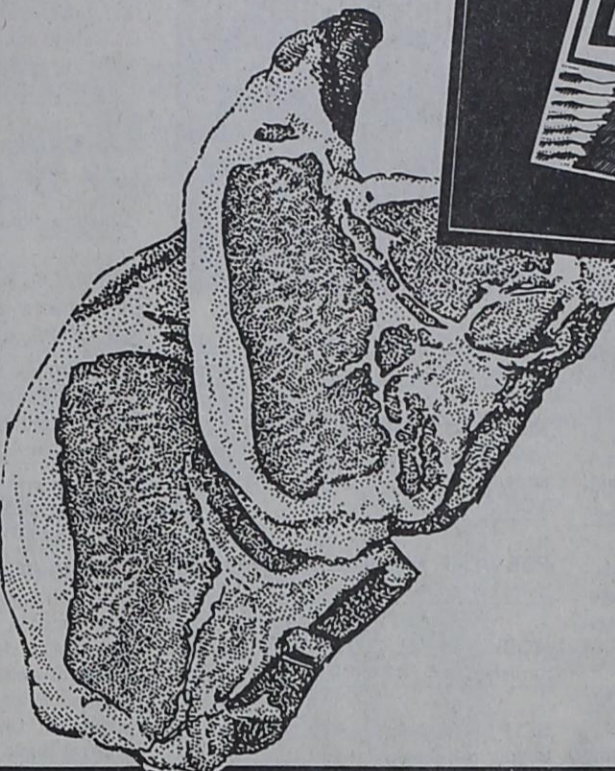

Four child care providers from Castro County recently completed a daylong training conference in Lubbock to update their professional skills, gain new ideas and attain state-required credits.

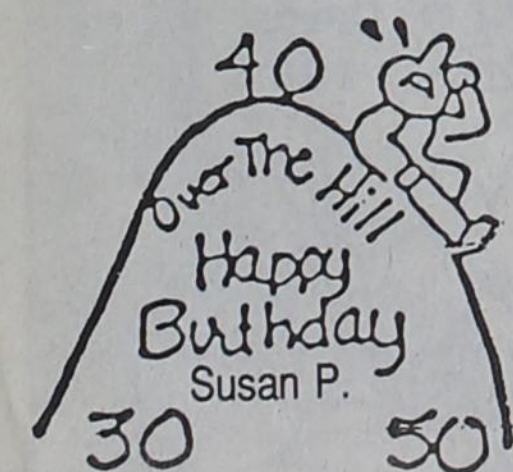

Dimmitt's Emilio Arce snared first team spots on both the Super Team and All-South Plains team.

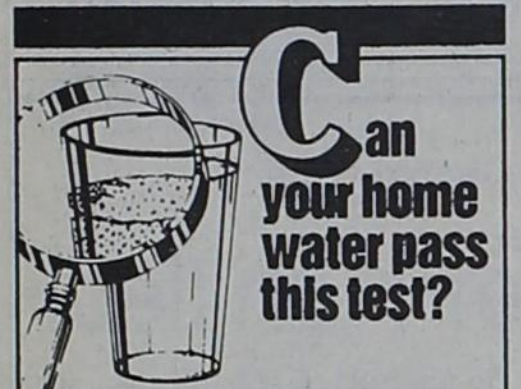

Police Calls

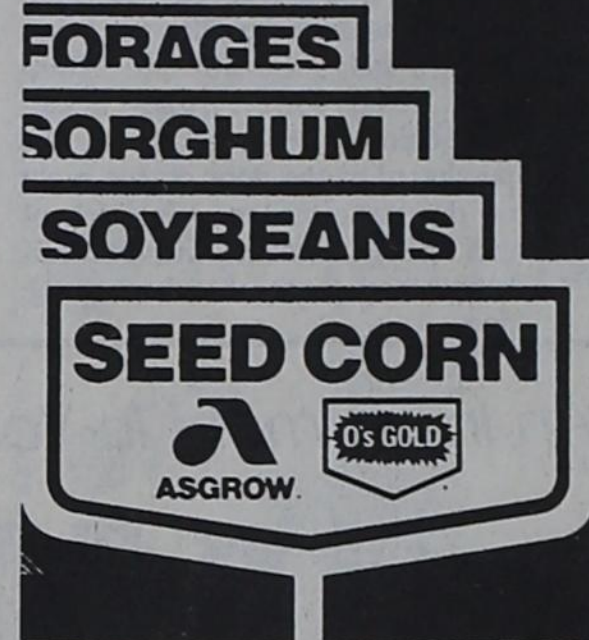

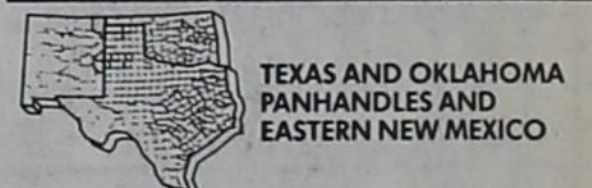

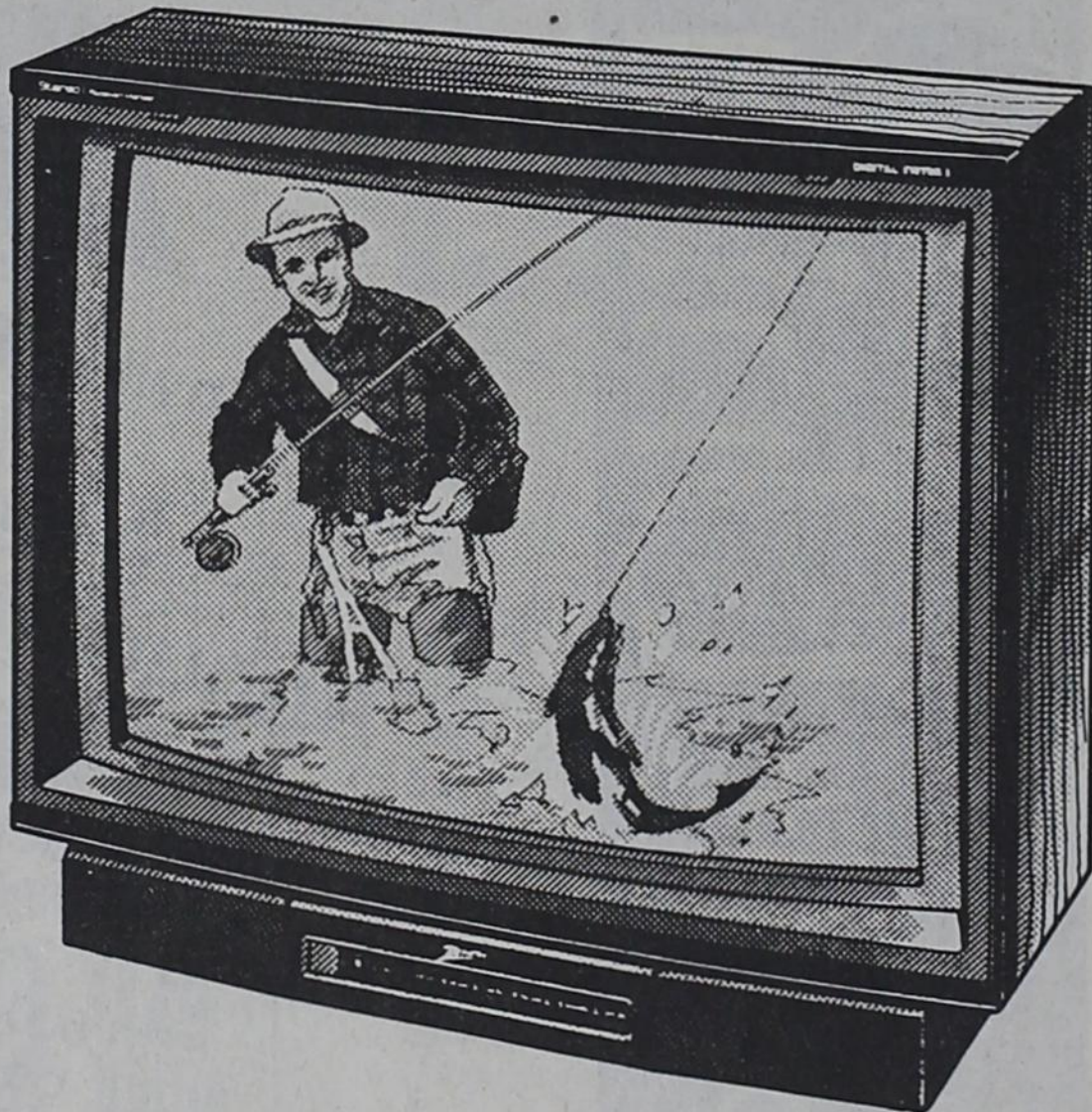
