Drusilla was the daughter of Herod who beheaded James, Acts 12:1,2. An elder sister of King Herod Agrippa, Grand-niece of the Herod before whom Jesus stood, Lk. 23:11, Great-granddaughter of the Herod who slew the babies of Bethlehem, Matt. 2:16. It was said that she possessed rare physical beauty, but, like her ancestors, was foul in character. She was living in adultery with Felix.
