A second plane will arrive tomorrow, after which the two cargo planes will make two round trips daily, transporting about 240 wetbacks a day. Destination of the first two flights is Durango and San Luis Potosi.

W. F. Kelly, assistant supervisor of the enforcement division of the Bureau of Immigration and Naturalization, was acting head of the airlift. He supervised a imilar airlift at the other end of the U.S.-Mexico border in El Centro, Calif., a week ago.

Kelly explained the airlift is the government's answer to the border patrolman's old problem of deporting a farm worker to the Mexican border, only to find him back at work in the valley he next day.

The government has chartered he planes from the flying tigers company, and will bear the entire cost, Kelly said.
