The Yugoslav "commodity" in which there is most interest seems to be this \$50,000-man army. Fifty-five per cent of the Yugoslav \$2.5 billion budget goes to support this force.

Match play was the original game of golf. All amateur championships are at match play. It's man against man, and they like or hate it, according to their temperament. It's a suicide schedule. One loss, and out you so yet there is more margin for error. and out you go, yet there is more margin for error. A player can take 10 on a hole, and lose nothing more than the hole. That would destroy him in medal play, which demands perfection.

In the PGA, 18-hole rounds the first two days qualify 63 to go on at match play with the defending champion. The qualifiers eliminate one another in two 18-hole matches the first day of match play, with 36-hole matches for four days taking two to the final on the seventh. The PGA is the Battle of the Iron Men.
