#### **OPS** To Crack Down On All **Violators**

FORT WORTH, Aug. 25 The Fort Worth District Office of Price Stabilization has underway a campaign to force compliance with OPS regulations in the 50-county district, Ellis H. Boyd, district director, announced Friday morning.

Enforcement investigators are checking on 12 slaughterers suspected of cattle price ceiling vio-

Preliminary reports indicated that 32 restaurants appear to have maintained inadequate OPS records. The special agents are conducting a widespread investigation of many other restaurants suspected of not keeping proper . records.

In addition to investigating cattle and restaurant suspects, much , of the business analyst staff is now checking on firms that have net filed, the proped reports under the different OPS regulations.

."Every opportunity has been given to those under OPS regulations to comply with the agency's

regulations," Boyd said. "Some have not complied and now we are going to force them to do so," he added.

"Businessmen, generally speaking, have been found to be in compliance and cooperative-our

aim is at the violator." "The time has come to stop kidding about this thing of enforcement of all regulations-we

are going to follow through on these investigations." "We really mean business,

Boyd reiterated. "We are going to check every business in the Fort Worth dis-
