WASHINGTON, Sept. UP)-The Justice Department is ooking into whether last week's elevision and radio blackout on the Turpin-Robinson fight was contrary to anti-trust laws, Rep. Pat Sutton, D., Tenn., said today.

Sutton said the department is making the study at his request. He said it is based on the proposi ion that "anything in interstate ommerce is subject to regulation by the government." Sutton contends TV fans were improperly lenied a view of the fight.
