SOUTHWEST CONFERENCE WILL OPEN TITLE FIGHT SATURDAY

Four Southwest Conference schools get their first taste of title competition this weekend as the scrap for the championship begins in earnest.

For two of the six teams involved in the three conference games—Texas Christian and Arkansas—the impending battles will be their second and third conference tryouts.

But Texas, which plays Arkansas, and Rice and Southern Methodist which meet in Dallas, as well as Texas A&M which goes against TCU at Fort Worth, all get their baptism into 1951 play-off-keep.

Texas, proud victors over Oklahoma last Saturday, will take a full complement to Fayetteville barring further injuries in practice this week.

Coach Ed Price said that only end Tom Stohlhandske and center Jack Barton were injured seriously enough Saturday to miss the workouts Monday. Both are expected to be in shape by Wednesday, Price said. The coach went to Douglas, Ariz., today for the funeral of Gilbert Dawson, Sr., father of halfback Gib Dawson.

The elder Dawson died Saturday while talking to his son in a Dallas hotel a few minutes before game time.

Arkansas, which has shown unexpected offensive power despite its two conference losses to TCU and Baylor, is also expected to be at full strength—and fired up—for the Longhorn encounter.

At Houston, Coach Jess Neely gave his 25 Rice varsity crewmen who saw action against Navy a rest yesterday, but sent the remainder of his squad through scrimmaging with the freshmen team.

Neely reported no injuries in the Owl upset over the Middies. Coach Rusty Russell also gave the Southern Methodist varsity a break, allowing those who saw action against Notre Dame to limber up bruised muscles without pads, then hear a scout's report on Rice and view movies of last year's Rice-SMU game.

The Texas Aggies, hardly tired from Saturday's breather with TCU encounter, devoting much of the day to plotting defense against the Horned Progs' spread formation.

The Trinity game wasn't without cost to the Aggies. Halfback Augie Saxe, a prime mover in the
