Plants Need To Be Fed

The members of the Civic League and Garden Club are interested in making Ranger a more attractive place to live, and they have submitted some articles on the care of your fall flowers.

This article was presented by one of the members which says: "Chrysanthemums have had a difficult time this summer. Those that have survived the intense heat need liquid fertilizer now. They need this nourishment up until and after they bloom.

Dahlias need some of the liquid fertilizer also. If given a generous amount they will pay off with larger blooms.

Beds should be cleared of all withered sinias and other annuals that have quit blooming. Leaves, weeds, grass clippings, etc., should be put into the compost pile to make soil.

Fall is the time to put your garden soil into condition. Fork it up in the fall and your spring work gets off to a flying start.

Even though the soil is "good" here are three things you can do to make it better. First, spread one to four inch layer of humus over it; second, make a generous application of plant food; third, fork it at least six inches deep, and 8 to 10 inch spading is still better.

By working your garden thoroughly in the fall and adding plenty of plant food and humus, you'll get your soil into the best condition.

The revival services that have been in progress at the First Methodist church this week will come to a close tonight with the evening services.


