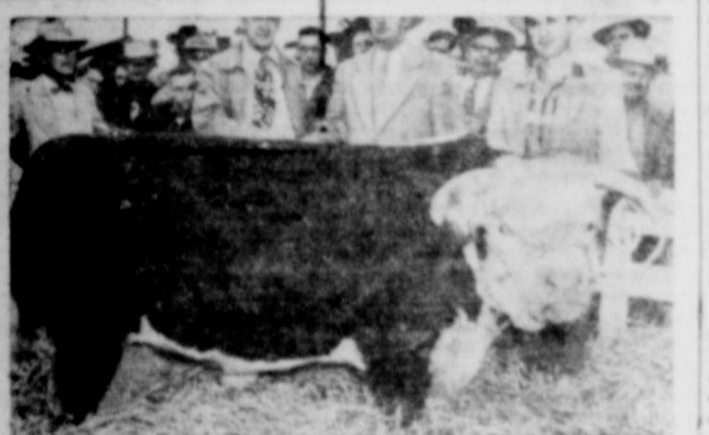

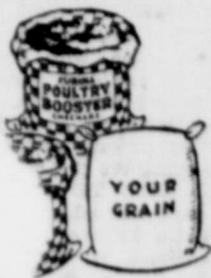

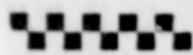

### U. S. Will Try To Lead Members Of UN To Peace

PARIS, Nov. 5 (UP)—The United States prepared today to lead the Western democracies in a double-barralled "battle for peace" at the sixth UN General Assembly which opens here tomorrow.

The western big three foreign ministers were "in complete agreement" on an American-drafted "peace proposal" which may suggest UN collective security machinery be strengthened and at the same time steps be taken toward world disarmament.

Such proposals have been studied by the UN before and now it is speculated U.S. Secretary of State Dean Acheson intends to take the initiative away from Soviet Union by proposing the Russians take an active part in UN collective security.

Acheson, pinpointing the western attack in the "peace battle" will lay the key question on the line: "Is the Soviet Union ready to consider a real peace or does it want to continue the cold war?"

The western strategy seems to line up as follows:

1. President Truman, in a major Foreign Policy address Wednesday night, will outline the western proposals which may include: A final peace in Korea; A new offer for world control of atomic and conventional armaments as a step toward disarmament; and UN-supervised elections in east and west Germany.

2. Acheson, addressing the UN General Assembly Thursday on the day before an address by Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Y. Vishinsky, will lay the American plan before the UN in the form of concrete proposals.

3. The UN will be called upon to bolster allied forces in Korea and possibly apply stiffer economic sanctions against Red China, according to predictions by two top U.S. State Department officials in Washington.

4. The U. S. will do everything it can to get Italy into the UN, according to assistant secretary of state John D. Hickerson. He said in Washington that while the subjects of Anglo-Iranian Oil dispute between Egypt and Great Britain are not on the agenda they undoubtedly will be discussed in open sessions.

### Fisherman Reels In Man In New Rescue Method

NEW YORK, Nov. 5 (UP)—Elbert Sprecher, 37, was surf casting for striped bass off far Rockaway Beach yesterday when he saw a swimmer in trouble about 50 yards off shore.

"He was being carried out by the undertow and I knew the only way to save him would be to send my line out to him," Sprecher said. "There wasn't even time to take the hook off the end. I cast it out three times and the third time it wrapped around his body and I pulled him in."

Witnesses said Sprecher drew his strange catch in so carefully that the sharp hook at the end of the line never touched the swimmer, Robert Stula, 59, who was barely conscious when brought out of the water. Stula said he swam in the ocean year-around as a health measure.

"He was lucky I was using a heavy line," Sprecher said. "He was my only catch of the day."

### Atlantic Union Wants Support Both Parties

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Nov. 5 (UP)—Both the Democratic and Republican parties were asked today to endorse Atlantic Union—a formation of a federation of free nations to keep the peace—and to seek official support of the plan in Congress.

At the closing session of its convention here yesterday, the group also voted to ask President Truman to call a conference of the Atlantic Democracies to explore possibilities of the envisioned federation.

Some 150 delegates reelected former U. S. Supreme Court Justice Owen J. Roberts president. Also reelected was vice-president Will Clayton of Houston, former under-secretary of state.

New board members elected include Marshall Webb, San Antonio.

### Officers Probing Sickening Gas

SAN ANTONIO, Nov. 5 (UP)—Officers began investigations today aimed at identifying a "gas with a horrible odor" blamed for the sudden illness of six south Bexar County residents.

The victims, all released after treatment at a hospital here today, were believed "poisoned" by the strange fumes when they answered a call for help to the home of relatives.

The mishap was preceded by a food poisoning incident which hospitalized George Rone, 29, his wife, Dorothy, 29, and their two children, Aronid, 9, and Billy Jean, 8.

The family became ill yesterday after eating sausage and went to Santa Rosa Hospital. They were treated and released.
