**"Mac" Backer Charges "Ike" Is Hated Man**

DALLAS, Feb. 29 (UP)—The chief of the national fighters for MacArthur has declared at Dallas that Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower is the most hated man in Europe. The charges are made by John Chapple, publisher of the Ashland Wisconsin, Daily Press and president of a group backing Gen. Douglas MacArthur for the presidency. In a radio address yesterday Chapple said Eisenhower is the most hated man in Europe because, and these are Chapple's words, "he gave away the city of Berlin to the hordes of Communist Russia." The publisher also claims Eisenhower was picked as a presidential candidate by what Chapple calls a Wall Street group of "pro-Soviet internationalists." These Wall Streeters, Chapple says, don't think President Truman can be re-elected and have settled on Eisenhower as a man who can win.

**Penney Medallion Designed By Famous Sculptor**

To celebrate its Golden Jubilee, J. C. Penney Company commissioned Julio Kilenyi, famous sculptor, to design a medallion symbolizing the department store chain's place in the American scene. Penney Company. **Waco Jury Says Texas Crime Is On The Increase**

WACO, Feb. 29 (UP)—A Federal Grand Jury at Waco warns that crime is increasing in Texas at what it calls an "alarming rate." It adds, in a report heard yesterday by state officers and officials from several Texas cities that there is evidence crime in the Southwest may be linked with a national underworld syndicate. The grand jury says increased narcotics traffic is the root of the alarming crime rate. It strongly recommends revision of Texas Narcotics Laws, including revival of the Texas Narcotics Bureau. The grand jury also urges that narcotics addicts be hospitalized rather than jailed, and calls for increased public awareness of the seriousness of the situation.

**WORLD NEWS BRIEFS**

**FRENCH GOVERNMENT QUILTS**  
 The resignation of the government of France has plunged that country into an economic crisis and threatens to delay indefinitely the Western rearmament program. Premier Edgar Faure quit this morning when the national assembly defeated a tax increase program aimed at helping France meet its defense commitments. These commitments are among the largest made by the Atlantic Pact Nations at Lisbon last week.

Yugoslav Marshal Tito has recommended settling the question of the Trieste Territory by private agreement between Yugoslavia and Italy. Tito told officials of the Yugoslav News Agency that he favors settling the question on the basis of an agreement to supplement the peace treaty with Italy.

**BRAND RUSSIA AGGRESSOR**  
 Representative O. K. Armstrong has proposed that Congress formally brand Russia as an aggressor in Korea. The Missouri Republican's proposal was contained in a resolution which he plans to introduce in the House today. The resolution also calls for expulsion of Russia from the United Nations unless the Kremlin ends the Korean War immediately.

**Making Coffee For Large Group Is Easy If Right Method Used**

Sooner or later every hostess is faced with the problem of making coffee for a crowd too large to be supplied from the family's largest coffee pot.

One popular solution has been to use two or more coffee makers for brewing as much of the total requirement as possible, and keeping this at serving temperature in separate containers while brewing the remainder. But the National Coffee Association offers a simple formula for making coffee in quantity, in a single operation. That is the old-fashioned steeping method, which can have very satisfactory results—if it is done properly.

To make coffee for 20 guests, with enough for second helpings all the way around, empty a pound of medium-ground coffee into a bag made from muslin or several thicknesses of cheese cloth. A clean pillow slip will do nicely. Tie the bag at the top with a cord long enough to be fastened to the handle of the container. This will make for easy removal when the brew is completed.

Be sure the bag is only half full of coffee, to allow for expansion of the coffee and to permit the water to circulate freely through the grounds.

Draw two gallons of water into a large kettle or enamel pail and bring to a gallinging boil. Then remove the kettle from the direct heat, and immediately insert the sack of grounds into the water, and using a stick or a paddle, push the sack up and down in the water, forcing the water to pass through the grounds.

Brewing takes about ten minutes. During this time, agitate the sack frequently. When brewing time is up, remove the bag and keep the coffee at serving temperature—taking care that it doesn't boil.

The proportions of coffee to water in this formula are based on the ideal brewing goal of getting 40 cups of brew from each pound of coffee. Therefore, the coffee requirements for a big crowd can be estimated and proportions recommended here adjusted accordingly.
