A trail of trampled Rel-star-ed caps marked a road to free-lom on Koje Island today.

Nati-Communist prisoners, 304 of them, broke away from their mrades as they were marching out of Compound 85 to smaller quarters and ran to safety be-hind Allied guards. A total of 11,000 war prison-

ers were moved to ay. That makes 61,000 grisoners shifted to smaller compounds.


