



"A hundred cowys on horseback couldn't per those ten buffalo on that little section of land," Pearson said. A buffalo will not turn and run rom a horse. They will turn to ace the animal and either charge with murderous intent or the ntire herd will scatter to the our winds when approached by a man on horseback.

Dr. Rinchart has, devised thre new stains which will aid in di covering how cancer manages t enetrate tough connective tissue known as basement membrane one type of which separates skir from underlying tissues. This ability gives the disease its invasive

Dr. Rinehart stains tissues and under the microscope, attempts to determine whether the basement membrane is defective in the early stage of cancer development, per nitting cells to break through.
