Weather Minor Factor In The Accident Rate

CHICAGO—You can't blame it on the weather!

In 84 per cent of the 32,500 fatal motor vehicle accidents last year, the weather was clear or merely cloudy. It was rainy, snowy or foggy in only one out of six fatal accidents.

According to "Accident Facts," the National Safety Council's statistical yearbook, which is just off the press, rain was the condition reported most frequently under bad weather conditions. Unfavorable weather conditions were reported more frequently for all accidents (including property damage only) than for fatal accidents. Rainy, snowy or foggy weather was reported for 21 per cent of all accidents and clear or cloudy weather for 79 per cent.

Daughter Of Ma, Pa Ferguson Dies At Austin Thurs.

AUSTIN, Aug. 1—Mrs. Ouida Ferguson Nalle, daughter of two former governors of Texas, died at an Austin hospital Thursday night.

Mrs. Nalle, 51, daughter of the late Gov. James E. Ferguson and Mrs. Ferguson, had been ill at Seton hospital for the past four months.

Survivors include her mother, Mrs. Miriam A. Ferguson—her husband; a son, George Nalle Jr.; and a sister, Mrs. Stuart Watt.

Mrs. Nalle authored "The Fergusons of Texas," which she subtitled, "Two Governors for the Price of One."

Her father, known to Texas voters in his first bid for state office almost 40 years ago as "Pa" Ferguson, was elected governor in 1914 and re-elected in 1916. He was impeached from the governorship in 1917.

In 1924, her mother, who hated to be called "Ma" although she was known by most Texans by that honey abbreviation of her first two initials, ran for governor on a "vindication" platform and was elected.

"Ma" Ferguson was defeated in 1926 and 1930 for the governorship.
