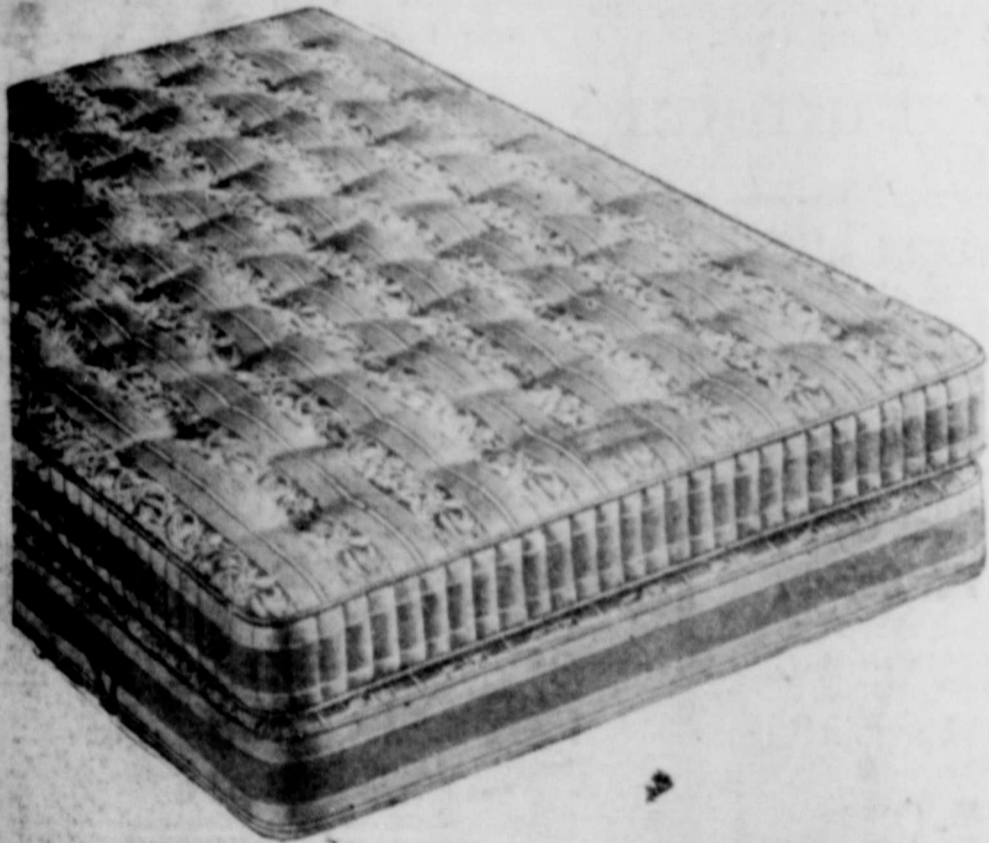

### Oklahoma Negro Given 20 Years Attempted Theft

DALLAS, Aug. 14 (UP)—Leonard J. Williams, 21-year-old Oklahoma City Negro who has confessed the July 3 robbery of the Spencer, Okla., State Bank,

faced a 20-year federal prison term Thursday as result of a late bank robbery attempt at Richmond, Texas.

Federal District Judge T. Whitfield Davidson sentenced Williams Wednesday for the attempted robbery on July 31. The Negro pleaded guilty.

He admitted to Judge Davidson that he had escaped from jails in Texas, Oklahoma and Utah 11 times in a 10-year period. Because of the escape record, Davidson

recommended that Williams be sent to Alcatraz to serve his time.

When captured a day after his abortive hold-up attempt at Richmond, Williams was wanted by the Texas prison system for escaping on May 26, 1952, while serving a 10-year burglary term.

Williams admitted taking some \$3,000 from the Spencer bank in Oklahoma. He said he spent the money on a Buick automobile purchased in Texas.

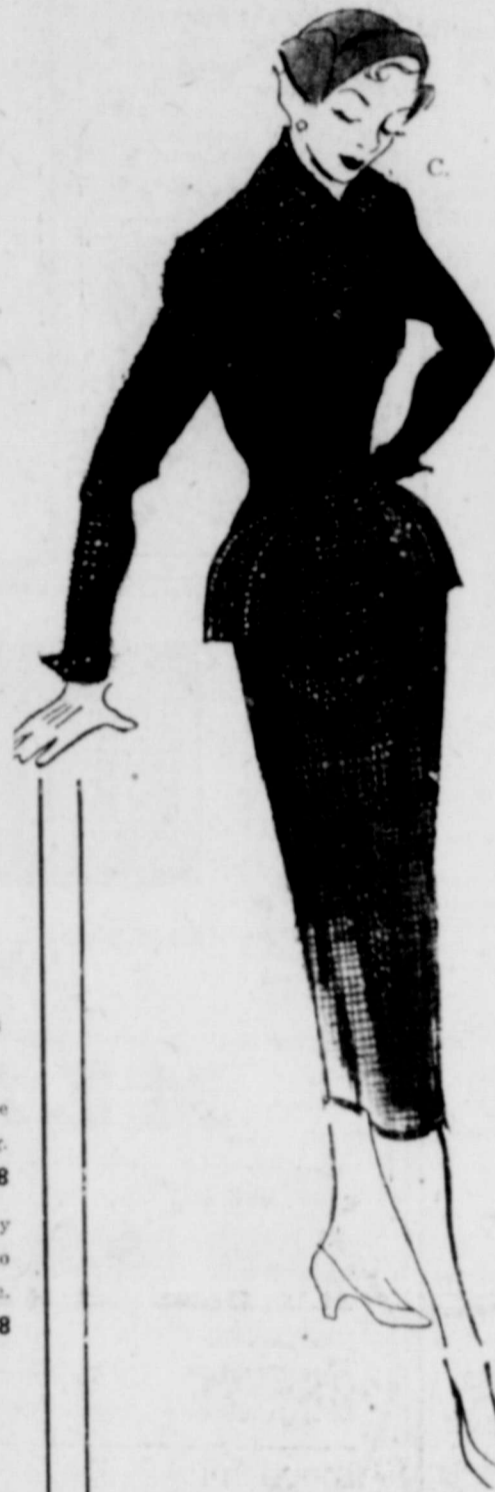

you stop you "beach it," and a "bedstead" is a sleepy pilot, good only for daytime driving.

A vehicle that needs to be towed is said to be "broke to lead."

"Friendly fellows" are broken jenders that trip in the wheel. The driver who makes a racket while shifting gears is a "gear fighter," and the police judge "affectionately" is called "Jesse James."

A hard riding truck is a "kidney buster," and noisy brakes are "cop callers." The livestock truck is a "bull hauler," and the drunken driver is the "undertaker's friend." A guy who doesn't dim his lights is known variously as a "foggy driver," a "blind driver" or a "stargazer."

When you "lose track" you are riding along with the wheels out of line. The "Lochinvar" is the driver who thinks it's smart to

drive only with one hand. When you speed you "floorboard," and when you crank a truck you "shake down her ashes."

This sort of language is used commonly by truckers all over the country.

No Floorboarding Rough Riders Most of them are not "rough riders" or fast drivers. They have received all sorts of safety awards

in the past and many a driver is proud of a long record without an accident. Some companies give awards in cash after so many miles without so much as denting a fender.

The Harvester people recently received an award from the National Council on Films for Safety for a movie it made called "A Day in Court."

The idea, of course, was to tell people how to drive safely and courteously.

"It is an interesting phenomenon that you can sell an American anything from a turnip shredder to cough syrup for canaries," one official said, "but his sales resistance is tremendous when he is asked to buy lives by safe and civilized driving."
