A TOTAL OF 7,519 pounds of milo per acre. The Frank Annen farm east of Dimmitt is the scene of this record milo yield. Five pounds of caprock milo per acre was seeded on Annen's land. The crop was watered five times and 65 pounds of anhydrous amonia was applied in the winter. The milo seen in the picture at the right yielded 7,519 pounds per acre while at left, which was not fertilized, produced 5,750 pounds per acre. This represents an increase of 1,769 pounds per acre on the fertilized tract for an investment of \$5.85 per acre or \$30.77 for every \$5.85 invested. Seen in the picture are Fred Annen and Edd C. 
Ag Census Delayed In Castro County

son. This makes the work of the emmerators more difficult and materially increases the cost of the undertaking. The information which farmers are being asked to supply is not only valuable to them in planning future operations but to business men who supply the farm mark-et's needs; agricultural leaders to whom farmers look for guid-arce and the agencies and organ-izations which service agriculture. 




