THE STATE OF TEXAS
COUNTY OF CASTRO—
To the Resident Qualified Electors of Commissioners' Precinct No. 2, Castro County, Texas, Who Own Taxable Property in Said Precinct and Who Have Duty Rendered the Same for Taxation.
TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held on the 22nd day of June, 1946, within COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, OF CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, to determine if said Precinct shall issue bonds, and if an annual ad valorem tax shall be levied annually on all taxable property within said Precinct sufficient to pay the annual interest and provide a sinking fund to pay the bonds at maturity, in pursuance of an election order made and entered by the Commissioners' Court of Castro County, Texas, on the 22nd day of May, 1946, and which order is in words and figures as follows:

ORDER OF THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT ORDERING ROAD ELECTION TO BE HELD IN COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NO. 2 OF CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS.
ON THIS 22nd day of May, 1946, the Commissioners' Court of Castro County, Texas, being in special session, there being present and in attendance the following members of the Court, at the regular meeting place thereof in the Courthouse at Dimmitt, Texas, to-wit:
EUGENE L. IVEY, COUNTY JUDGE, presiding; and
THOMAS R. DAVIS, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 1;
ANDY M. THOMPSON, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 2;
JAMES O. AYERS, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 3;
JOHN C. STORK, COMMISSIONER, Precinct No. 4;
and, among other proceedings had, were the following:
There came on to be heard and considered the petition of Sid Sheffy and more than fifty (50) other persons, as residing property tax payers within COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, of CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, praying this Court for an order for an election to determine the following proposition:

"WHETHER OR NOT the bonds of COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, a political subdivision of CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, shall be issued in the total principal sum of \$200,000.00, for the purpose of constructing, maintaining and operating macadamized, gravelled or paved roads and turnpikes, or in aid thereof, and which bonds are to bear interest at a rate not exceeding 2 1/2% per annum, and are to be payable at such times as may be deemed most expedient by the Commissioners' Court, but not to exceed 20 years from the date thereof; and that at such election there shall also be submitted to the qualified property taxing voters of the said COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT 2, the question as to whether or not ad valorem taxes shall be levied on all taxable property within the said COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, for the purpose of paying the interest on the said bonds and to provide a sinking fund for the redemption or payment thereof at maturity."

AND IT APPEARING TO THE COURT that said petition was presented to this Court, and filed with this Court, on the 6th day of May, 1946, and that it is duly signed by more than fifty (50) resident qualified property taxing voters of said Commissioners' Precinct No. 2, of Castro County, Texas; and, of said notices so posted at each of the three public places in the County of Castro County, Texas, on the 6th day of May, 1946, by order duly passed and entered of record, this Court set said session down for hearing before the Commissioners' Court, at a session thereof to be held in the Commissioners' Court Room in the Courthouse in the City of Dimmitt, Texas, on the 22nd day of May, 1946, at 2:00 o'clock, P. M., which was not less than fifteen (15) nor more than thirty (30) days from the date of the aforesaid order setting such petition down for hearing; and,
IT FURTHER APPEARING TO THE COURT, from the evidence submitted, that notice of this hearing was thereupon given by the County Clerk in the time and manner required by law, and which notice informed all persons concerned of the time and place of such hearing and of their right to appear at such hearing and contest for or protest the ordering of such bond election, and, further, that the aforesaid notice also stated the amount of the bonds proposed to be issued, and described the boundaries of said Commissioners' Precinct as such boundaries are described and defined in the order of this Court establishing said Commissioners' Precinct Number 2; and, further, that the aforesaid notice also designated the roads to be constructed and improved; and,
IT FURTHER APPEARING TO THE COURT, and the Court so finds from the evidence submitted, that the Clerk of this Court, pursuant to the order setting said petition down for hearing, posted and published the notices of such hearing in the time and manner required by law; that is to say—

(a) The County Clerk and Ex-Officio Clerk of the Commissioners' Court of Castro County, Texas, executed said notice by posting three copies thereof in the following three public places within COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, of CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, to-wit:

(e) That the said County Clerk also caused said notice of this hearing to be published in the CASTRO COUNTY NEWS, which is a newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in Castro County, Texas, and which said notice was published in said newspaper on the 16th day of May, 1946, which date was at least five (5) days prior to the hearing set for the consideration of such petition; and

AND WHEREAS, on this the 22nd day of May, 1946, and being the date set for hearing said petition, the said petition came on to be heard and considered in regular order; and

WHEREAS, it appearing to the Court that if said bonds are voted and issued, the money received from the sale thereof will be applied to the construction and maintenance of—
A road beginning at the North East corner of Section 4, Block 0-3, Castro County, Texas; Thence South along the East line of Block 0-3, T. & R. 0-4, Thence South across Section 1, Block T-4, Castro County, Texas, to a point in the North line of Section 3, Block 2, W. E. Halsell Subdivision, Castro County, Texas; Thence East to Office Clerk of the Commissioners' Court of Castro County, Texas, executed said notice by posting three copies thereof in the following three public places within COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, of CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, to-wit:

(1) That the petition for said bond election is signed by more than fifty (50) of the resident qualified property taxing voters of COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, OF CASTRO COUNTY, TEXAS, and who had duly rendered their property for taxation.

V IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the manner of holding such election and canvassing and making returns thereof, shall be governed by the General Laws of this State, when not in conflict with the provisions of Chapter 16, of the General Laws passed by the Thirtieth Legislature, at its called session in 1926, and amendments thereto.

VI IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that notice of said election shall be given by publication of a copy of this order in the CASTRO COUNTY NEWS, a newspaper published and having a general circulation in Castro County, Texas, for three successive weeks before the date of the said election, and, in addition thereto, there shall be posted three copies of this order at three public places in said COMMISSIONERS' PRECINCT NUMBER 2, and also at the door of the County Courthouse, in the City of Dimmitt, Texas, and all of which notices shall be posted for three successive weeks prior to said election.

The County Clerk is hereby authorized, ordered and directed to post and publish notices of said election as hereinabove directed, and returns of said election are made by the duly authorized election officers and received by this Court. The duties herein imposed upon the Clerk may be performed by said Clerk or by Deputy, as provided by law for other similar duties.

You no doubt have read or heard statements regarding the advance in the retail price of farm machinery which was announced by OPA on Saturday, May 11th, which inferred that the increase in price to the farmers was only 3 percent. May we at this time call your attention to the fact that this is incorrect; the raise in the retail prices in most cases is 5 percent but the raise to the manufacturer on a wholesale basis is 10.25 percent. This increase in price was due to the requests from manufacturers of farm equipment primarily because of increases in labor costs and the increased costs of materials and component parts needed to manufacture farm machinery.

Dealers' operating margin has been reduced 20 percent by OPA's new regulation.

This means that your farm equipment dealers must operate from now on, on a 20 percent less working margin than they had before May 10, 1946.

This means that your service dealer, even though his operating costs have mounted tremendously during this war period, must operate on a lesser margin than he had during World War II. When all other industries nationwide were demanding increases for their products, your farm equipment retailers did not ask for any increase.

This decrease means that many of your farm equipment retailers will be forced to curtail the services that have made it possible for you to operate during these emergency periods with many obsolete machines even when new repair parts were not available.

This means that many farm equipment dealers may be forced to remove from their pay rolls mechanics, servicemen and other employees, many of them G. I.'s, so that their operating costs will be in line with their earning margin.

This means that many dealers, because of this "squeeze" in dealer's working margins, may be forced to close their doors and discontinue their operations.

All we ask of you, Mr. Farmer, is that you consider your welfare, and if you feel that we have done a good job for you during these "Hectic years", that you please contact your Congressman and Senators and ask them to restore to us the working margins we had before this new OPA ruling. Please bear in mind that we are not asking for any increase, but we cannot stand a reduction at the present time if we are to continue our operations. We would be pleased to have you stop in at our stores to discuss more thoroughly this program which is threatening to destroy the farm equipment retailers of America.
