#### **Cost of Living Moves Down During Month**

Eastland County's budget tretching families were heartened Saturday with the report from Washington that the cost of living as measured by the government eased off two-tenths of one per cent during the month ended in mid-December.

It wasn't much of a decrease But-it will help.

Reporting the drop, the Burgat of Labor Statistics (BLS) said that a 1 per cent decline in the retail price of food was chiefly re-

Rises in some other items held the drop in overall living costs to two-tenths of 1 per cent.

BLS said that on Dec. 15 its ndex of the retail price of food, clothing, rent and a score of other items bought by moderate income city families stood at 190.7 per cent of the 1935-1939 base period. This index figure was 8-10 per cent higher than a year ago and 12 per cent higher than in the period just before fighting began


