### Plastic Tent For **Plant Cuttings**

of rooting plant cuttings under plastic tent has been developed at Harvard University's Arnold Arboretum in Jamaica Plain.

Perfected by Lewis Lipp, chief propagator at the arboretum, the levice can be used by both amaeur and professional gardeners.




