From 25 to 30 per cent of TV interference is caused by customer's appliances, such as heating pads, refrigerators, neon and fluorescent lights. From ten to 15 per cent of the complaints are traceable to utility equipment, and about five per cent comes from radio transmitter equipment and industry equipment, the magazine's survey shows.

The major utility contribution to television interferences lies in voltage regulation. Nominal 115 volt lines dropping to 108 volts

### Taxes On Liquor Show Increase; Fines Assessed

Revenues collected by the Texas Liquor Control Board during March were greater than those for the same period last year.

The board's monthly review for April, released today, gives March collections as \$1,488,936.85 as compared with \$1,450,006.82 for March, 1952.

The review is issued to give the public factual information about the board's activities and to encourage co-operation among all agencies working for better enforcement of the liquor laws, says Coke R. Stevenson Jr., state liquor administrator.

The biggest part of the revenue is from the distilled spirits excise tax, which brought in \$923,008.01. Beer excise tax payments amounted to \$294,549.10. Other sources were the malt liquor, wine, beer, and international bridge excise taxes, permit and license fees, and miscellaneous.

Two prohibition elections were held in Texas during March, with the result that two precincts that had been wet for beer voted dry.
