Take the case of the near-fiasco British National Health Service for instance. Officials of this socialized edicine headquarters credit the Ofree health service with a major mprovements in British health. 'The service has brought hundreds of thousands of patients into doctors' surgeries and into hospitals early enough to check the spread of ease" one official says. The ministry points out that there has been an 80.6 percent drop in tuberculosis leaths in England and Wales in the last ten years and a reduction in the infant mortality rate from 33.9 per thousand when the service an 1948 to 22 per thousand now.

But despite these happy omens of progress in health standards, the abuses of this system leaves it unworkable for all time. Britons are about like us in thoughts, actions, and backgrounds. What applies to their nature would apply to ours also. Since and health service be-gan, abuses of the system have been widespread. Britishers seek led health services, drugs and time off from work now that there is little or no cost involved. This has become a widespread debacle, resulting in outrageously ov-ercrowded hospitals, long waits, and impersonal care. A British doctor averages about 3,500 patients, some three times the American average. Critics of the plan charge it floods doctors offices with people with imaginary ills. "It's a hyhondriaes holiday," as one man

The cost has risen tremendously. The first year of Britain's National Health Service the program cost \$1.2 billion, but by last year it had bubled to \$2.2 billion.

This practice is recommended if rainy weather conditions have prevented timely rotary hoe use or for a rotary hoe to eradicate. Cetton that has been dirtied up is difficult to oil properly. Have the tions in the row between the nozzles. Cotton that has been rolled at planting time or rotary hoed is satisfactory for treatment. If the cotton is planted in a water furrow or if the cotton is severely affected by seedling disease, it should not be treated. Rain or dew on the grass will reduce the efficiency of




