He was director and producer of two weekly radio programs interpreting the college to its constituent area and served as instructor in the department of philosophy and religion. Mr. Wenger is a graduate (B. A.) of Bethel College, Newton,

Kansas, and of Texas Christian University from which he received his graduate degree (B. D.) in religion in 1948. While a student at TCU's Brite College of the Bible, he served as pastor of Christian churches at Hamilton and Arlington, Texas. He served for two years as associate pastor of the First Christian Church at New Castle, Pa. During World War II, Mr. Wenger was a Chaplain in the United States Army with combat duty in Belgium, Luxembourg, Germany, and Austria. 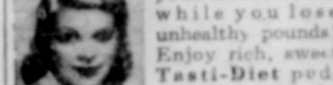
