Premeasure of **Cotton Offered** Here Again

Premeasured cotton acreage is again offered this year to produc ers by the ASC office, but in most cases at an increased rate over weeks. They have won one and last year, according to an announ-lost one in their past games with last year, according to an announcement by Charley Hill, ASC sec- Muleshoe. The regional tourna-

Determination of the premeas arement cost will be based on the reporters salary for estimated time involved while on assignment the farm, stakes, mileage, and the cost of office work involved in computing acreages and the prep aration of notices.

"It will, of course require a lot more time for irregular or contour plots than for regular or straight rows therefore increasing the cost to the farmer," Hill noted. The premeasurement of cotton

is a service that is being offered by the ASC office and is not compulsory. All cotton in the county will be measured at a later date with no cost to the producer for the first measurement.

Hill also said that it is the producer's responsibility, when he requests the service, to assist the reporter in making the necessary measurements.

Applications for the premeasurement of cotton will be accepted between February 6 and March

Also concerning cotton was an announcement that applications will be taken in the county until April 14 for released cotton ac reage allotments.


