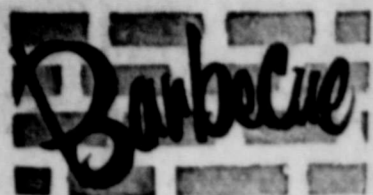

### New Sunday School Study Plan Starts at Church of Christ

A new and revolutionary plan of religious education will be instituted by the Sunday School department Sunday at the Church of Christ, corner South Rusk and Mesquite Streets, Bro. Max Crumley, new minister, announced Saturday.

The series, consisting of little journeys into Bible-land and four other successive journeys through the Bible, was about 12 years in preparation and coincides with the development of a child, the minister declared.

It's a 12 year course, beginning pre-school and continuing, year-by-year, through the 12 grades. Each journey through the Bible will cover a span of three years of Sunday School study, and students will be graded and report cards will be given as is done in regular public school work.

"This is a new idea in religious training," Bro. Crumley told The Times, "and we feel that it will be of untold benefit to scores of young men and young women, boys and girls as they grow into manhood and womanhood."

"This new plan is being instituted in our Ranger church Sunday morning in 13 classes of the Sunday School department, including pre-school groups, and all children are extended a cordial invitation to enroll."

The basic plan of the new "closely graded series of studies for Sunday morning Bible classes at the Church of Christ includes: Little Journeys in Bible Land—One year's material for Pre-School children, is the beginning of this series.

The First Journey Through the Bible — is for the Primary grades. As the child begins his first grade work in Public Schools he starts at the beginning of the Bible. He continues his study straight on through the Bible during the three years he is in grades 1, 2 and 3.

The Second Journey Through the Bible — is for the Intermediate grades, 4, 5 and 6. In these years the child goes again all the way through the Bible, getting material additional to that of the First Journey and the familiar material in greater detail.

The Third Journey Through the Bible — is for Junior High School, grades 7, 8 and 9. Again the child goes straight through the Bible, learning many additional things which he is able to comprehend at this age level.

The Fourth Journey Through the Bible — is for Senior High School pupils, in grades 10, 11 and 12. This fourth time through the Bible gives the pupil a thorough grasp of its marvelous history; its wonderful principles; its hope for immortality. This course is also suitable for classes of adults who have never had such a systematic study of the Bible.
