

Cisco Signs Street Paving Contract Tuesday

CISCO (Sp.) — The City of Cisco Tuesday night entered an agreement with E. H. Shaver of Dallas to pave several city streets.

The Shaver company submitted a bid on asphalt pavement as follows: 18-foot pavement, 90 cents per running foot; 20-foot, 99 cents; 22-foot, \$1.08; 24-foot, \$1.19; 26-foot, \$1.30; 28-foot, \$1.40; 30-foot, \$1.50, etc.

Safety Through Car Care Urged

Mile for mile, motoring was safer last year in 17 other states than it was in Texas, where 6.3 persons were killed in traffic accidents for every 100 million vehicle miles of travel for a total of 2,342 dead.

The state's standing in traffic death rates was brought out in a special study conducted by Universal C.I.T. Credit Corporation, the nation's largest sales finance company.

Nationally, seven persons were killed per 100 million vehicle miles, the lowest mileage death rate the nation has ever had, according to the National Safety Council. A total of 38,300 persons were killed in traffic accidents during 1953, a 1 per cent increase over 1952.

Many of the drivers involved in fatal accidents, said L. M. van Noppen, a safety expert with Universal C.I.T. Credit Corporation, could have avoided the tragedy by keeping their vehicles free of mechanical defects.

As operations vice president for the automobile financing company, van Noppen supervises C.I.T.'s own

wagons, his own two feet and rowboats.

The veteran physician's favorite tale concerns the time-honored practice of putting off payment of bills.

"I delivered a baby many years ago over in Sharp County," he recalls, "and forgot about the bill until she was grown up and married. One day I mentioned it to her father, and he soon came around and settled up. I charged him \$6, though, the fee during all those years had gone up to \$25."

Dr. Tibbels began preaching after he was ordained a Baptist minister in 1918. He held fulltime pastorates at Imboden, Pleasant Grove, Cedar Springs and Black Rock. As he grew older, he held half-time pulpits, but gave this up three years ago. He is still called frequently to act as supply pastor for many congregations.

The doctor purchased the only drug store in town about 16 months ago and moved his office into the rear of the building. Since he is not a licensed pharmacist, he mixes only his own prescriptions.

For 25 years Dr. Tibbels has recorded the history of Black Rock in his weekly columns published in the Walnut Ridge Times Dispatch and the Imboden Journal.

For many years before that, he wrote a column for the Sharp County Record, now located in Cave City, when it was published in Smithville.

Dr. Tibbels, married to the former Miss Aurelia Shaver Southworth of Evening Shade for 48 years and father of six children, has been a member of the city council for many years.

After a full life in this world, Dr. Tibbels is already preparing for the inevitable time when he starts on still another career. For seven years, he has had his own tombstone installed in a cemetery plot in which there are, as yet, no graves.

There's no date on the stone, and if Dr. Tibbels has his way, there won't be one there before 1965. He plans to live until he's 86 and become "the oldest member of my tribe."

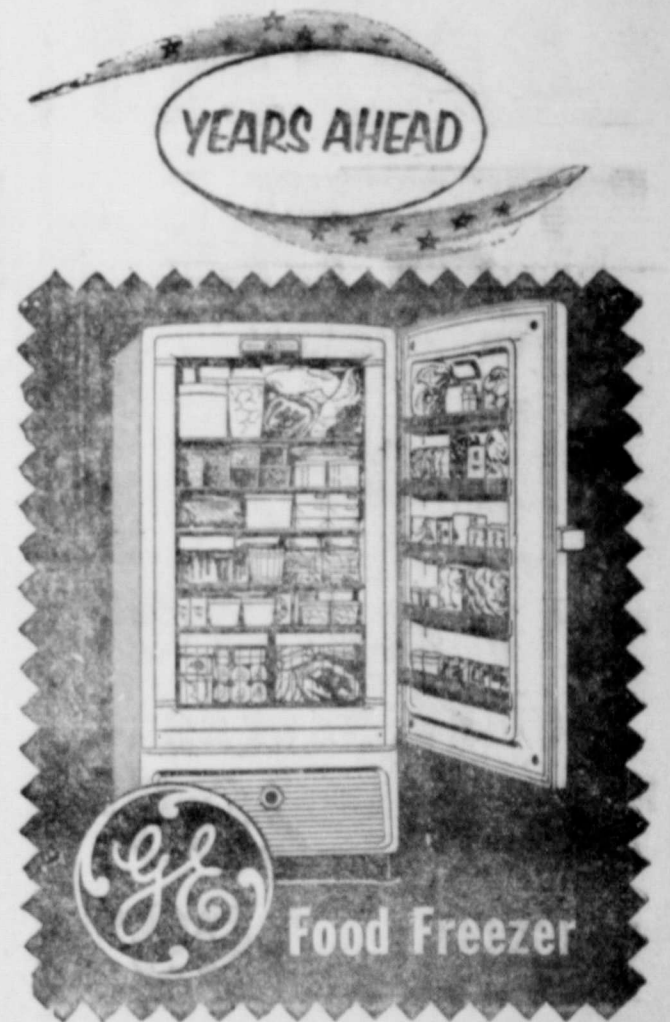

Several of the junior high school kids are out of school because of the mumps. Here is hoping that you kids have a speedy recovery.

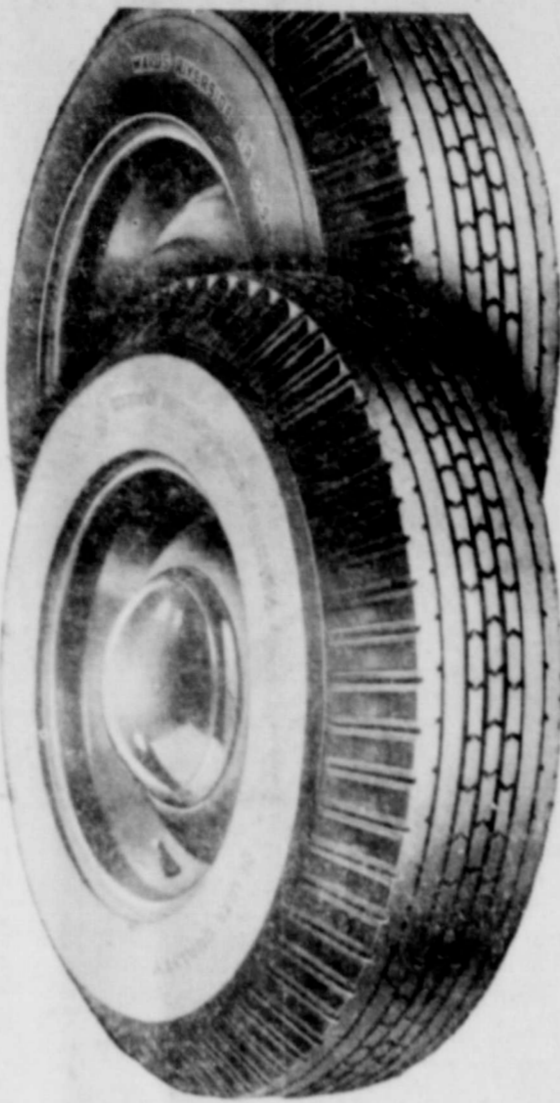
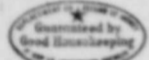
