





Measures Explained

Got a good idea for a new in vention floating around in the back of your mind? Yes? Perhaps to protect your rights you should file an application for a patent

with the U.S. Patent Office. Under the patent laws of the United States, an application for patent must be filed, if, at all, earlier than one year after date of first public sale or use or pub-lished disclosure of the invention. If this deadline is met, then the

person who first conceives a new and novel patentable idea is en-titled to it, provided he thereafter pursues a course of reasonable dil-igence in reducing his invention to practice or filing a patent applica-tion thereon. Therefore, if con-flicting claims arrive as to who is entitled to a patent, it is necesary to establish who first had the dea, and not just who filed the irst application for patent.

Since an inventor is automatic-lly given credit for a date at st as early as his application, thout having to introduce any oof, an early application date is vantageous though not conclu-
