#### Citizens, Express Your Views!

Recent events over the state indicate that many important decisions probably will face the next regular — or called — session of the Texas Legislature.

Calvin Brown, Ranger chairman of the Democratic party, has been contacted by Lieut. Gov. Preston Smith Established June 1, 1919 and requested to report the sentiments of local citizens.






