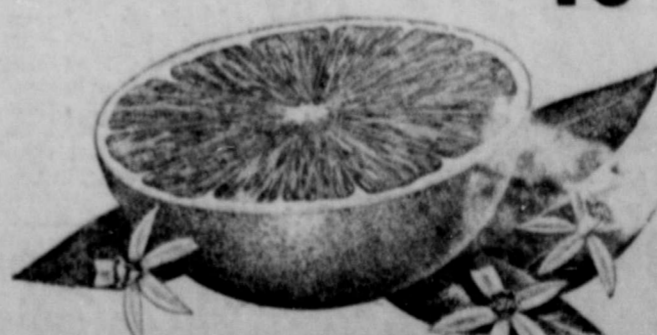

ECWSD Issues New Color Map Of Lake Leon

The board of directors of the Eastland County Water Supply District has just issued a new three-color map of Lake Leon, showing the location of commercial boat docks, public camp sites, public launching areas, public facilities (including restrooms) also the location of Lone Cedar Country Club and golf course.

The lake itself is designated in blue with a green background, and the roads around and approaching the lake are printed in red. Laws and regulations regarding the use of the lake are printed on the reverse side of the map, size 15 by 18 1/2 inches, on heavy white paper. The map folds to size 4 1/2 x 7 1/4 inches.

The maps are available at the various commercial boat docks, the Ranger and Eastland Chambers of Commerce, sporting goods stores and at firms who issue boat and fishing permits, according to M. H. Perry, of Eastland, president of the board.
