Agricultural financing will be the topic for the regular monthly meeting of the Eastland County chapter of Young Farmers to be held in the vocational agriculture classroom at Olden High School Monday evening, July 27, at 8 p.m.

Representatives of major agricultural financing agencies of the area will comprise a panel to participate in an open discussion. The panelists will include Glyn Gilliam of Commercial State Bank and Lester Crossley of First Federal Savings & Loan Assn., Ranger, Homer Cole of the Eastland County Farmers Home Administration, Dick Weson of the Eastland County Production Credit Assn., and Mr. Payne of the Federal Land Bank, Breckenridge.

Charles Veale of Ranger, the Young Farmer chapter president, says all persons with an interest in agriculture are invited to attend the Monday night session.

A question and answer period will follow explanations of the various financing programs available.

The Eastland County Young Farmer Chapter was organized and chartered last spring and has been presenting interesting and informative programs each month. The membership consists of all persons of the Eastland, Olden and Ranger area who are interested in farming and ranching in any way. Monthly meetings are held usually at the Olden school the fourth Monday night of each month. The chapter entered the first

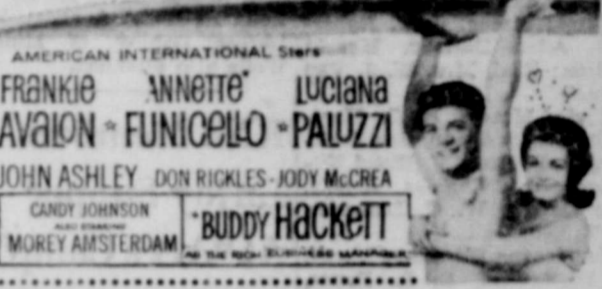
