**El Paso Man Is
Named District
Farm Agent**

John E. Burleson, El Paso County Agricultural Agent since 1960, on March 1 will become district agricultural agent for Extension District 8 with headquarters at Stephenville. Burleson replaces R. G. Burwell who retired on January 31, 1965. The Central Texas district is composed of 20 counties, including Eastland County.
In making the announcement, Director John E. Hutchison, Texas Agricultural Extension Service, said Burleson has made an outstanding record in each of the positions he has held since joining the Extension Service in 1951. He is a native of Eastland County but did most of his growing up on a Comanche County farm.
The new district agent is a graduate of De Leon High School, Tarleton State College and Texas Technological College with a B. S. degree in horticulture. He has also done graduate work during summer sessions at Texas A&M and Colorado State Universities and regular sessions at Texas Western College. He served in the U. S. Navy during 1945 and 1946.
Burleson was first employed by the Texas Extension Service in 1951 as an assistant county agricultural agent in Hood County. He was transferred to Johnson County within the year as assistant county agent and to Tarrant County in 1963. He was named county agricultural agent for Navarro County in 1964 where he served until his transfer to El Paso County.
Hutchison said Burleson has directed outstanding educational programs in each of the counties he has served for both adults and 4-H Club members. He has been very successful, the director added, in getting widespread support and cooperation on the many

Connally was inaugurated as the 38th governor of Texas in 1963. In line with his campaign theme, he proposed and supported an aggressive program to the 58th legislature with primary emphasis on excellence in education as the vital key to the future of Texas.

Cancer Is Major Child Killer, Reports Head Of County ACS Unit

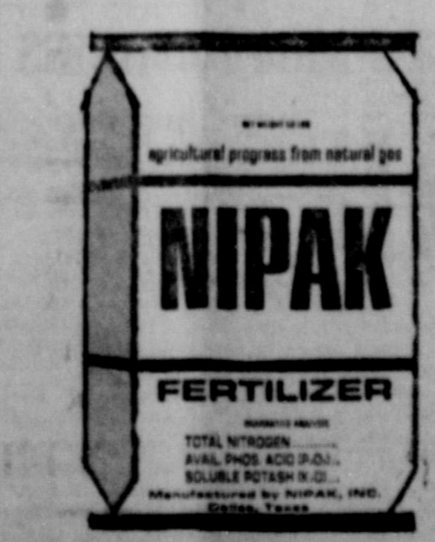
"More school children will die of cancer this year than from any other disease," said Sam Kimmell of Cisco, chairman of the Eastland County chapter of the American Cancer Society. "That's why so many mothers will be working in the Cancer Drive early in April."
"About half of the cancer deaths in children are from leukemia, which is a cancer of the blood-forming tissue, but this type of cancer is not primarily a disease of children. There is an increasing rate among adults," Kimmell reported.
"The American Cancer Society is currently supporting more research on leukemia than on any other form of cancer and many scientists believe that cures will be found for leukemia sooner than for any other cancer. We are seeing some progress now because we have drugs which can extend the lives of children with acute leukemia."

for many months and in some cases for as long as seven or eight years."
"Like adults, children should have regular physical examinations but there are some warning signs that should be called to the physician's attention if they persist longer than two weeks. We urge parents to watch for: swellings, lumps, or masses in any part of the body; pains, or the persistent crying of a baby or child, for which no reason can be found; any change in the size or appearance of outward growths, such as moles or birthmarks; nausea and vomiting for which there is no apparent cause; a marked change in bowel or bladder habits; bloody discharge of any sort; blood in the urine; heavy spontaneous nose bleeds or other type of hemorrhage; failure of bleeding to stop in the usual time after a cut or injury; unexplained stumbling in a child who has been walking well; a general "run-down" condition," Kimmell explained.
"We know," concluded Kimmell "that the people of Eastland County will be generous when their neighbors call on them in this year's education and fund raising drive."
