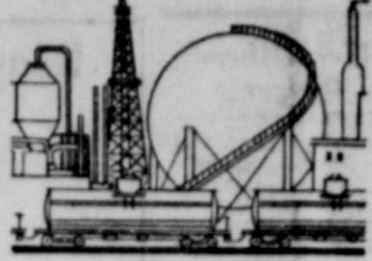

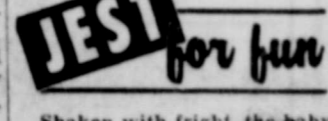
Mrs. P. M. Kuykeddall is camp chairman for the Ranger Service Unit committee.

In not too many days the colorful rodeo bunting and flags will adorn Ranger's streets and business buildings.

The occasion, of course, is the upcoming 1965 Ranger Jaycee Rodeo to be unveiled here on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 8, 9, 10.

Doyle Gentry, in charge of advertising and publicity for the arena event, said that representatives of the Harbin Decorating Co. of Dublin will be in Ranger in a few days to contact merchants and businessmen regarding the decorations.

The program for the '65 Rodeo is now at the printers, Gentry said, and several hundred colorful placards have been distributed over a wide area. In addition, eye-catching bumper stickers have been placed on hundreds of passenger cars and trucks.

Kenneth Pendleton, president of the Ranger Jaycee organization, reminded Wednesday that tickets for the rodeo are now on sale at Commercial State Bank, the Globe Clothiers and Anderson Chevrolet in downtown Ranger.

An open amateur show, the competition opens with a gala parade in downtown Ranger Thursday afternoon, July 8, at 5 o'clock. Hundreds of visitors are expected to swarm into the city to watch the procession which will feature several sheriff's posses, riding club groups, and commercial floats and displays.

George Rogers Killed In Auto Crash Friday

George Rogers, 62-year-old former longtime Ranger area resident, was killed in an automobile accident five miles from Truth Or Consequenza, N. M., Friday afternoon.

Mr. Rogers was a field representative for the Sperry & Hutchinson Co. He had been with the firm for six years. Prior to that time he had been engaged in the dry cleaning and laundry business in Ranger and Strawn for a number of years.

He had been back from a jet trip to Europe only 10 days prior to the fatal accident.

Mr. Rogers was a member of the Baptist Church and the Masonic Lodge.

Survivors include his widow, the former Phyllis Williams of Ranger; three daughters, Gloria and Georgia Ann of El Paso and Kathy of Germany, all married; and six grandchildren.



T&P Fireman Seriously Hurt In Accident

R. A. Pickles, middle-aged Fort Worth man, was in serious condition in Ranger General Hospital Wednesday as a result of injuries received in a fall from a moving train Tuesday about 6:45 p.m.

Pickles, a brakeman for the Texas & Pacific Railway, apparently lost his balance and tumbled off a box car. The accident happened near Prairie Crossing.

He was rushed to the hospital in a Killingsworth ambulance.

Pickles suffered three broken ribs and internal chest injuries.

Charles Culpepper Blair Will Be Honored With Historical Marker At The Original Site of Fort Blair

Graham, Texas March 31, 1963

We have written her to bring the book as she comes up here the last of the week. Then I'll be able to answer your questions more accurately.

P.S. Mrs. Gilmore, My auntie, Texas Smith, asked me to do this for her, but she appealed to a niece in Stephenville who has a History, but some of the pages

are out, so the info is scant. If you will send these papers (questions) back, I will get this History from San Antonio and give you more explicit information. Texas thinks this should be sent on to you, then you may send it back, and I'll see what I can do. We have had a lot of sickness, therefore the delay.

Texas Smith was 91 years of age when she dictated this

letter containing the following information to Mrs. Gilmore. She died May 23, 1964.

Charles Culpepper Blair founder of Blair's Fort, an historical fort located six or seven miles southeast of Masker Lake is to be honored in the near future with the placing of a historical marker relating his story.

Blair was born in Ireland and came to the U. S. when he was 20 years old and settled in Georgia. Later he

moved to Tennessee and then to Eastland County about 1855. He married the former Mickey Reeves, and they had nine children. The three sons were Mack, Owen, and Loyd, and the six girls were Sara Jane, Charis, Metzora, Delphia, Adaline, and Nancy.

Sara Jane married Barry Moore Keith, a charter member of the Texas Rangers. His father was Gabriel Keith.

head of the famed organization. Charlie married A. F. Reeves.

Melora married Joe B. Smith, (Texas Smith was their daughter), who was an Indian Scout and Confederate soldier. The following story relates an episode that Smith lived through:

In December of 1860 Joe and Rall Smith, "Bad" Reese and Golston Flanagan left Flanagan's ranch at what is now Merriman, to go to Blair's Fort, in quest of something with which to make bread. They were in a wagon to which was hitched a yoke of young steers and started down the road which at that time followed in a general way the crest of what the present Eastland-Cheaney Road crossed the River. In doing so it crossed several draws, less brushy, and it was at one of these that they drove into an ambush.

Flanagan was mortally wounded, probably by the first volley of shots, and fell back into the wagon, as did Smith who was struck in the knee by an arrow. The young steers stampeded, turned abruptly around and raced back up the road for a hundred yards or so, then bolted for the timber, some distance away, where they huddled a tree and broke the yoke, which enabled them to continue their wild flight.

It was here that Joe Smith leaped from the wagon, and ran into the timber, where he waited for Golston, thinking that he, like himself, might be in hiding, but failing to find him, returned to the ranch, where he reported the incident to "Bad" Reese and Rall Smith, who took horses and went to hunt for Flanagan, finding him dead and scalped.

His body was brought to the ranch and buried on a little knoll in the field east of the road, just south of the bridge across Colony Creek, at Merriman, where his ashes still rest.

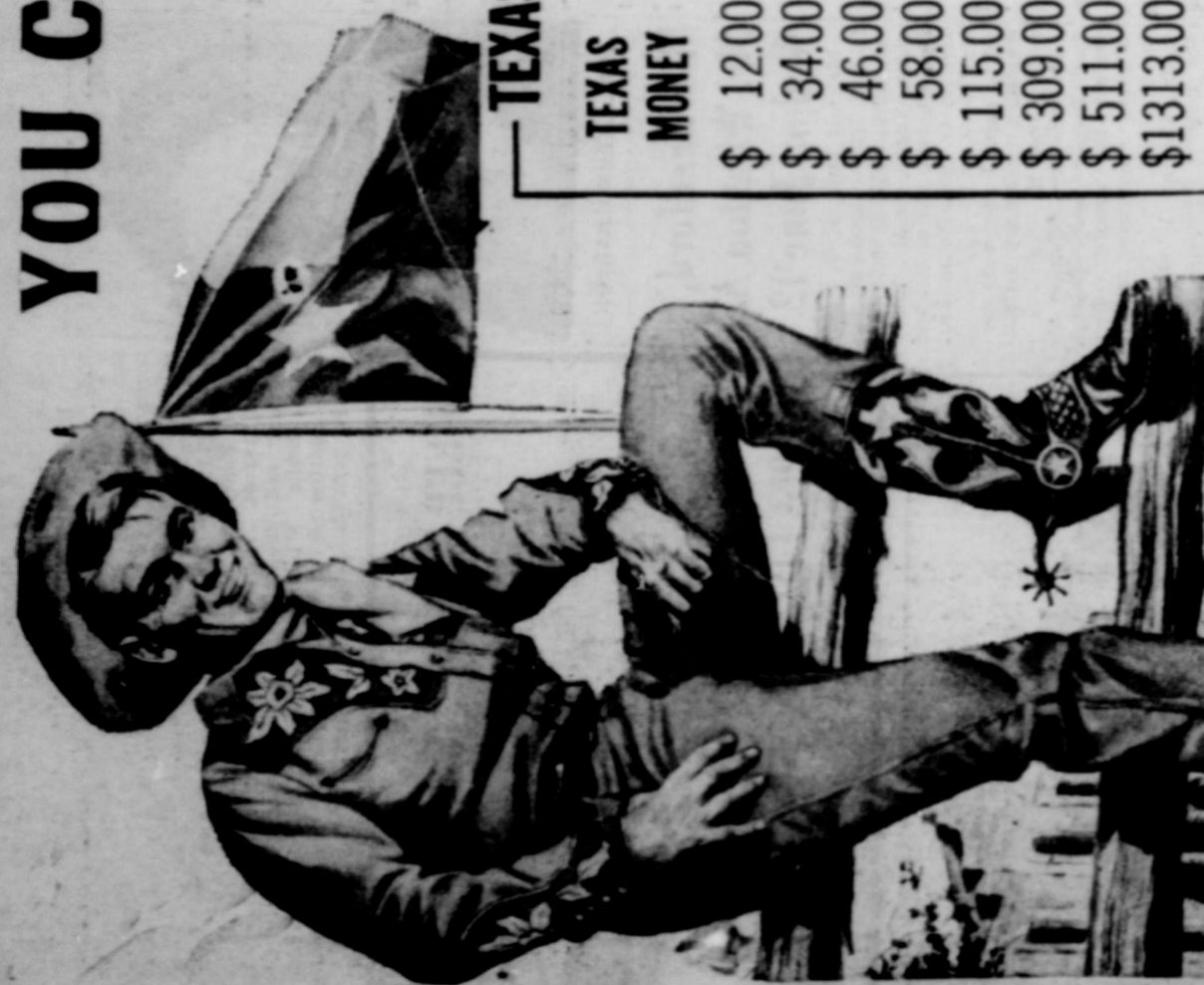

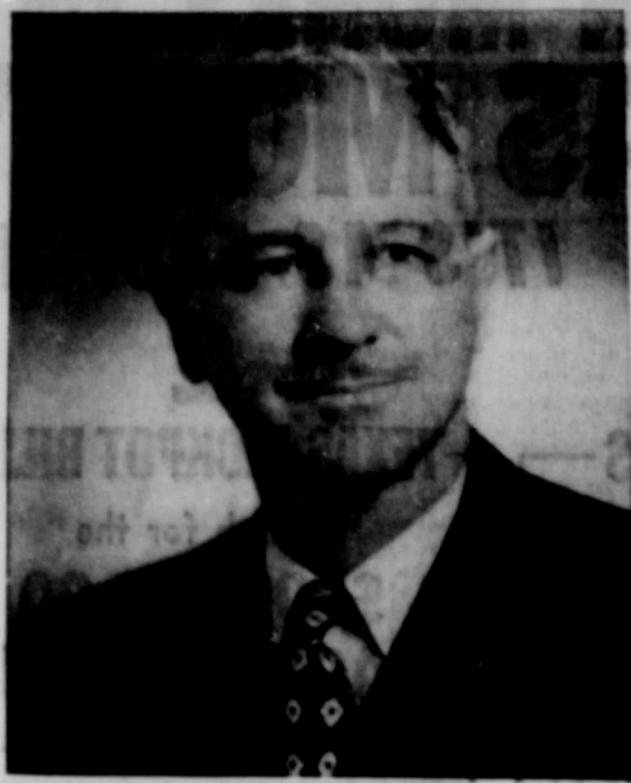
Record Number Enroll Monday In Bible School

Funds Now Available for Historical Markings

The Texas Historical Foundation of Texas has received word that there are several money grants to aid in the placing of historical markers around the state of Texas to promote the tourist industry.

On the local scene, the Eastland County Historical Committee has erected four historical markers in county towns. There are two markers in Cisco, one in Eastland, and one in Ranger.

Eastland County has a budget toward the historical markers of \$500.00 a year. The Moody Foundation has set aside a \$10,000 grant. This grant is for the erection of Official Texas Historical Markers to commemorate phases of early Texas travel and transportation. The subjects and locations for these markers will be chosen from counties who are actively supporting Ramps.

Another available money fund is the State Marker Fund. The State has appropriated \$40,000 for the erection of Official Texas Historical Markers. This fund is available for any spot designated to the history of Texas. Soon to be announced is a \$5,000 grant from another

Foundation to erect Official Texas Historical Grave Markers for law enforcement officials who did outstanding work during their lifetime. These markers will be taken from Landmarks List.

The Humble Oil and Refining Company supplied the Historical Survey Committee with 17 beautiful reproductions of famous Texas scenes. The stipulation is that they be sold only to hotels and motels.

The Historical Committee of Eastland County is headed by Mike Collins. The committee is made of different citizens from the Eastland County towns.

The markers are very important to Eastland County itself. In a joint survey conducted by the Texas Highway Department and the Texas State Historical Committee of Tourist Information Markers over the state it was determined that each marker earns \$526 per month, and \$6,405 per year in increased tourist revenue to the state.

The statistics show that the money turning in the Eastland area means growth for all Eastland County towns.

ASC PLANS TO BEGIN CROP MEASUREMENTS WORK SOON

Measurements on peanuts, feed grain, cotton and diverted acreage will begin in the near future, according to Jesse G. Meredith, Eastland County ASCS representative.

Account sales on mohair well as wool and unshorn lambs should be submitted to the county office for the period January 1, 1965, through December 31, 1965. Mr. Meredith said. Current prices received by producers indicate that the prices will be below the 72 cents price support rate.

Measurement service is available to those producers who request it and pay the cost for same through the office.

In response to inquiries regarding 1965 wheat marketing cards, Mr. Meredith said cards are not required. He reminded producers who have signed to participate in the 1965 Feed Grain and Wheat Stabilization program that the area cannot be grazed from May 1 to November 1, 1965. July 1 is the last date that producers may file application for new grower wheat allotments for the 1966 crop year, he added. June 30 is the final date to sprig coastal bermuda under the 1965 ACP program.

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced the following 1965 price support rates for Eastland County, Mr. Meredith said:

Wheat, grade No. 1 or better, \$1.26; oats, grade No. 3 or better, \$.70; barley, grade No. 2 or better, \$.85; grain sorghum, grade No. 2 or better, \$1.70.

Application for a farm storage facility loan will be accepted from producers needing grain storage bins, the representative stated.

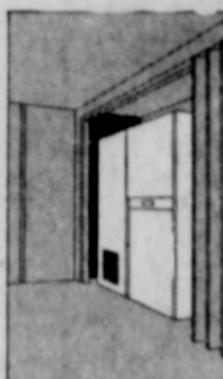
