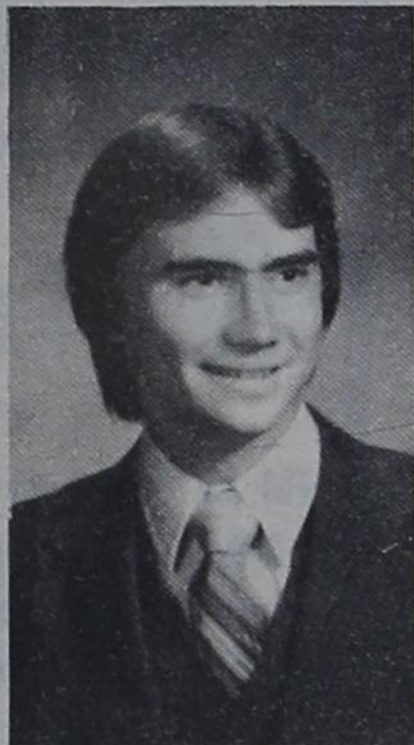

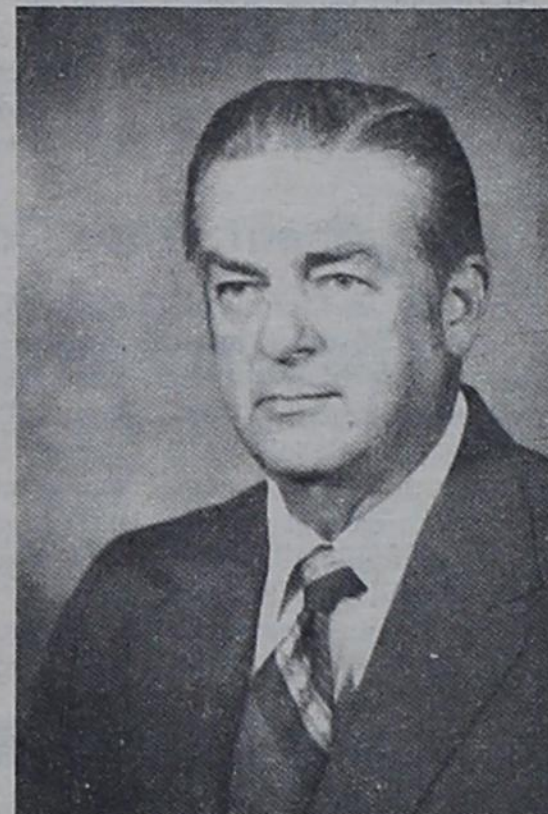

## Eula Group Fights Tax Increase, Seek Tax Alternative

A proposed \$1.6 million bond issue to finance a new Eula Elementary School is being rejected by the Concerned Taxpayers of Eula School Independent School District. The opponents want to consider alternatives to construction.

Taxpayers fear that property taxes will double if the bond proposed passes. Concerned Taxpayers evant the tax increase kept to a minimum.

A property tax increase is expected after property is appraised in October. Reappraised property value notices will be mailed out after June 1.

If the group is successful and defeats the issue they plan on meeting with trustees and asking them to consider renovating the existing building.

A San Angelo consulting engineer inspected the school recently and projected that with food renocation the school would last only 10 years.

Consolidation is another alternative being considered. Taxpayers could expect a tax increase if Wylie or Abilene by consolidating, and Clyde schools are over crowded already.

## Grant Loses At Regional- Medalist Honors To McCamey

Medalist, Sid Grant, traveled to Odessa last week to compete in the Regional Golf Tournament.

Grant shared the medalist lead after the first day of play with a 72, as he birdied two of the last five holes.

## County Agent Urges Cattle Grub Control

The time to control cattle grubs is once again upon us, according to Greg Gerngross, County Extension Agent in Callahan County. In this area, chemicals to control grubs should be applied between May 15 and July 15 with the best control usually resulting from May treat-

ments. Grubs, often called "warbles" or "wolves", cost livestock producers millions of dollars annually. Losses occur due to damaging meat and hides and also by reducing the general efficiency of the animals.

Cattle grubs can be effectively controlled with

systemic insecticides-insecticides which when applied to the animal is absorbed into the blood system to provide control of grubs migrating through the animal tissues. These can be applied as spot-ons, pour ons, sprays or dips.

# WTU Holds Groundbreaking For Coalfired Power Plant

Groundbreaking for West Texas Utilities Company's first coal-fired power plant will be held Saturday, May 22, at the plant site eight miles southeast of Vernon.

The public ceremony at 2 p.m. will be jointly sponsored by WTU and the Vernon Chamber of Commerce. Participants will include U.S. Representative Jack Hightower of

Vernon; Glen D. Churchill of Abilene, president of WTU; Bob Arnold, Wilbarger County judge; and Roy Dickey, Jr., mayor of Vernon.

A luncheon for members of Vernon civic clubs and their spouses will be held earlier at the Wilbarger Auditorium in Vernon.

The Oklaunion Power Station will be a joint project of three operating

companies in the Central and Southwest System. WTU will be the major owner and will operate the plant, while Public Service Company of Oklahoma and Central Power and Light Company will own smaller shares.

Total capacity of the plant's first generating unit will be 640 megawatts. Construction is expected to take more than four

years, with the unit scheduled for commercial operation in December, 1986. Boiler fuel will be low sulphur coal from Wyoming.
