This photo, from the Smittisonian Institute in Washington D. C., shows a section of the original aqueduct that served the watè needs of the conquered city of Cologne, Germany. It was constructed in 80 A.D. by the engineers of Fabius Sabinus Titus, Emperor of Rome, The aqueduct extended 56 miles underground between Cologne, and Eiffel and served as the main artery for the Cologne water supply until the fate 1920's
