St. Paul, Aug. 20 .- Serious charges erainst Governor Brady of Alaska, have been made in the Transmissis sippi congress by Donald Fletcher of Beattle, who asserted that the governor was the exponent of a policy of oppression and repression and was the active agent of the great commercial companies in delaying self-government while they gobbled up the best of a magnificent country.

He took issue with Governor Brady's recommendations in his last report to congress for the full exten sion of the land laws to Alaska, as serting that the recommendation had an ulterior purpose and was in the interest of the political element dominating the progress of the territory.
