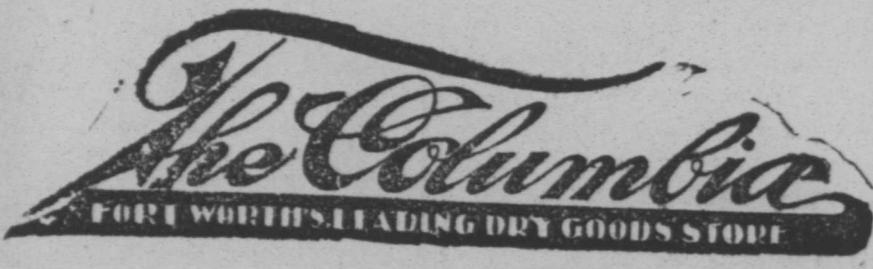

MURDER FOLLOWS A CHARGE OF BIGAMY

TWO INCIDENTS CONNECTED THOUGH CHAIN OF FACTS ARE NOT MADE PUBLIC

(By Associated Press.) JACKSON, Tenn., Feb. 13.—Albert Bilderback, formerly of Cairo, Ill., and Miss Lucy Hudgins, a member of a prominent family, were married yesterday. Late in the day a warrant was sworn out by the father of Miss Hudgins, charging Bilderback with bigamy, it being claimed that he had a wife in Cairo.

Last night just before midnight the doorbell of Mrs. Freeman's boarding-house rang and when Robert McCay stepped to the door he was shot to death. Police near by rushed to the scene and arrested Mrs. Hudgins, who was near the scene of the shooting.

The police are connecting the marriage and the shooting. The facts are not all made public, but a thorough investigation is now being made.

GRINNAN ALONE AGAINST THE SENATE

(Special to The Telegram.) AUSTIN, Texas, Feb. 13.—The matter of investigating the drawing for long and short terms of senators held on Jan. 28 was reopened in the senate this morning upon a motion to adopt the resolution of the senate committee sitting as a committee of the whole, not exonerating the two officers charged with fraud.

Senator Davidson moved to adopt the report and pending a vote on the motion Senator Grinnan, one of the signers of the resolution that called for the investigation and who was absent at the time it was held, secured the floor and spoke on the matter. He opposed the adoption of the report on the grounds that the investigation had been railroaded through and he felt sure that had a careful investigation been held the results might have been different.

Senator Davidson asked him if he had specific charges to make against any employee or any senator. Mr. Grinnan replied that if the case were reopened he intended placing all the four-year senators on the stand. Davidson repeated his demand for charges and Grinnan stated that a lawyer never tried a case upon the facts that he had in his possession, but upon the evidence secured from his witnesses.

Mr. Grinnan then served notice that in the event the senate insisted upon adopting the report later on he would be heard from in the matter of personal privileges.

Senator Perkins, who was also a signer and who was absent when the investigation was on, stated that he was satisfied with the results and would vote for the adoption of the report.

A vote was taken and the report was adopted by a ye and nay vote, Grinnan being the only senator who was heard to say no.

HONORS LINCOLN In the house yesterday a resolution was adopted that when it adjourned at noon it do so in honor of Abraham Lincoln on account of its being his birthday anniversary. This shows the patriotic spirit of the lawmakers of Texas.

Yesterday was truly a day of consolidations of railroads. Two consolidation bills were passed in the house without a dissenting voice. The bills will now go to the governor for his approval. The legislators are determined to adjourn sine die at an early date if resolutions providing for such an adjournment counts for anything. Yesterday another sine die resolution was introduced in the house, this time by Mr. Cunningham, and it provides that the legislature shall wind up its affairs by March 15, almost a month earlier than the resolution presented in the house yesterday. The resolution went over.

DR. MAXWELL MARRIED IN HOUSTON WEDNESDAY

Brown, the ceremony being performed by Rev. S. M. Tamey of the Second Presbyterian church. Miss Clewom, who is a cousin of Mrs. Brown, is a native Houstonian, and has many friends in this city. Dr. Maxwell is a prominent physician of Fort Worth, for which point the newly wedded couple left last night to make their future home.
