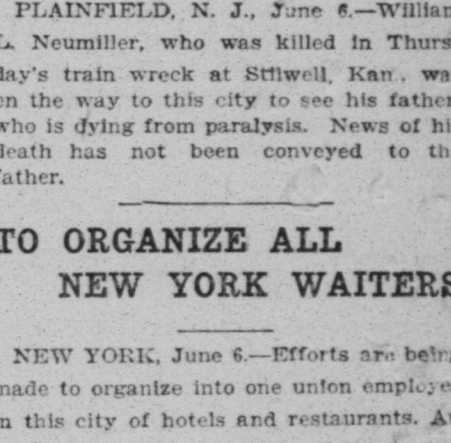
FIRE IS CAUSED BY TROLLEY CAR
