TELLS OF MEETINGS DOWN THE RIO GRANDE A Country Especially Adapted to Farming and Fruit Raising—Conditions All That Can Be Asked—Demand Is Now for More Farmers

PRESENT CONDITIONS Present conditions are considered by Mr. White as the best arguments which can be presented for Texas. "There are a lot of lecturers going about over the country telling of the 'great future' of Texas," said Mr. White.
