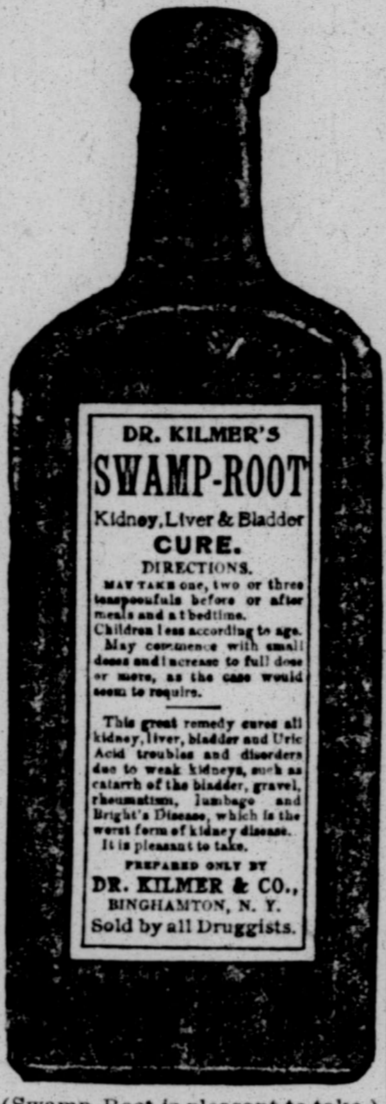

WINTER WORK IN FIGHTING THE MEXICAN BOLL WEEVIL

(Special)—The following valuable article on "Winter Work Against the Boll Weevil" has just been issued.

With the advent of killing frosts and cold weather the Boll Weevil leaves the cotton fields to a considerable extent and those remaining leave the plants and seek suitable shelter for hibernating.

By deep winter plowing most of these weevils are buried and destroyed.

The Boll Weevil enters the ground from cotton and corn in the fall and three or four inches beneath the surface forms an oval cell in which it transforms to the pupa or chrysalis, in which state it passes the winter.

When the pupae are broken up, many of the pupae crushed, others thrown out to be picked up by birds, and by far the larger part are destroyed.

A lessening of this and other insect deprivations. Winter breaking puts the land in better shape for early planting and makes a better seed bed.

PAY TRIBUTE TO LLOYD'S MEMORY

Expressions of Praise for Henry Demarest Lloyd Heard at Chicago

CHICAGO, Dec. 1.—Tribute to Henry Demarest Lloyd and the work which he gave his life has been freely given in a great mass meeting at the Auditorium. Every phase of the activities of the writer and thinker was taken up, and in each was found, by the speakers, new evidence of his loftiness of character, correctness of judgment and soundness of reason.

Others who addressed the gathering touched on other traits of Mr. Lloyd. Edwin D. Mead of Boston lauded his constructive ability in refutation of the charges of some that he was merely a critic.

Mr. Mead quoted the opinions of Robert Louis Stevenson, who wrote that Mr. Lloyd had not three peers in America in his command of the English language. The memorial exercises were conducted by the following organizations and institutions: Garment Workers, American Federation of Labor, United Turner societies, Chicago Federation of Labor, Village Council of Winnetka, Carpenters' District Council, Typographical union No. 16, municipal ownership delegate convention, Henry George Association, Hull house and Chicago Commons.

A delegation from the anthracite miners of Pennsylvania was present as follows: District No. 1, Thomas Nichols, president; John T. Dempsey, secretary; Adam Ryscavage, vice president, and John Fallon of the executive board; district No. 7, W. H. Dettery, president; J. P. Gallagher, secretary, and P. G. Four thousand persons were present at the meeting.

Decision of Judge Raymond Regarding Indian Leases a Hard Blow

TULSA, I. T., Dec. 1.—The Indian Territory is anything but a paradise for those who would thrive from the revenue derived from dealings in Indian lands. Conservative estimates place the losses sustained by the various realty companies operating in the territory at not less than \$1,000,000. Three of the best known are said to have lost \$175,000. One company here lost \$36,000. Today it is insolvent, with its assets wrapped up in dead Indian claims and leases that have been declared invalid by a recent decision of Judge Raymond.
