WATER PIPE FRANCHISE Perhaps the next most important issue in the meeting was the question of granting a franchise to A. R. Knowles to lay water pipe in the city of North Fort Worth...

Authority to lay pipe has previously been granted to John M. Moody of the North Fort Worth Water Company...

Knowles did some work in laying pipe in North Fort Worth but a complaint was made by Moody who said that the council had granted him the right to lay pipe and supply water...

Several members of the council were in favor of granting Knowles permission then and there, but after weighing the matter it was decided to let the street and alley committee look into the question and report at the next meeting...

There was some little indecision as to whether it is necessary to grant Knowles a franchise or whether a verbal agreement would permit him to go ahead with the work.

A NEW ORDINANCE A motion was made and carried instructing City Attorney Valentine to draft an ordinance creating a license for those who wished to do scavenger work...

It was also decided to name in the ordinance the duties of the superintendent of the dumping ground.

The dumping ground question arose from the fact that the North Fort Worth dumping ground has been used by every one without rules or regulations.

CITIZENS' MEETING Mayor Pritchard announced that a meeting of the citizens of North Fort Worth will be held in the city hall Wednesday night...

It was decided to hold the bond election next Tuesday. Only tax payers will be allowed to vote.

Warrants for the payment of several bills against the city were issued, among them being for repair work in the city hall and for the printing of election tickets.

RAILROAD NEWS

ROCK ISLAND RATES For the reunion of the Texas division, United Confederate Veterans, at Temple, July 29 to 31, the Rock Island has authorized fare...

For the annual meeting of the Texas Optical Association at Greenville, July 14 and 15, a fare and one-third is given.

On July 15 and 16 there is to be a

grand basket picnic at Chico. A one fare rate for the round trip has been authorized.

At Duncan, I. T., July 14 and 15, there will be held a barbecue and picnic. One and one-third rate has been granted.

A merchants meeting at Kansas City will be held during August, September and October. For this occasion the Rock Island will give a one and one-fifth rate for the round trip.

MAY EXTEND LINE

The management of the Rio Grande and Nueces Valley Railroad Company has asked the citizens of Eagle Pass to aid in the extension of the road to that point.

It is proposed to extend the line south to a connection with the Kansas City, Mexico and Orient. A part of the road in Texas has been surveyed, but where it will cross the border into Mexico will depend largely on the action of the people of Eagle Pass and Del Rio.

HONDURAS RAILROAD TRUST

News has been received here that the American United Fruit Company in Honduras, through Minor C. Keith and Sir William C. Van Horne, is about to obtain control of the railroads in Honduras and thus establish a Central American railroad trust.

As stated recently, it is reported that this road is soon to pass into the control of the Squires syndicate of New York, who will then turn it over to the fruit company.

A NEW SONORA ROAD There is a prospect that another railroad is to be built in the state of Sonora by a wealthy English syndicate, who has asked information as to the resources of that country from the Mexican consul at El Paso.

ELECTRIC MINING ROAD

M. D. Watson, the Chicago man who holds the title of the Rosamaria mines in the Autlan district of Jalisco, Mexico, has confirmed a report concerning the construction of a railroad from the mines to Navidad, a port on the Pacific.

According to Mr. Watson the road will be operated by electricity and will cost \$1,500,000. The current is to be secured from power plants built along the Cusapala and Santa Maria rivers.



**JONES OF TOLEDO PASSES AWAY AT HIS HOME**  
Death Comes to the Golden Rule Mayor Who Was Well Known All Over the Country

TOLEDO, Ohio, July 12.—Samuel M. Jones, the "Golden Rule Mayor" of Toledo, died at his home this afternoon at 5:07 o'clock as a result of a complication of diseases. The immediate cause of his death was an abscess on his lungs. The mayor had suffered for years from asthma, and this was the primary cause of his fatal illness.

In business Mayor Jones was as democratic as the principles he advocated. In the Acme sucker rod factory, owned by him, the only rule in force is the golden rule.

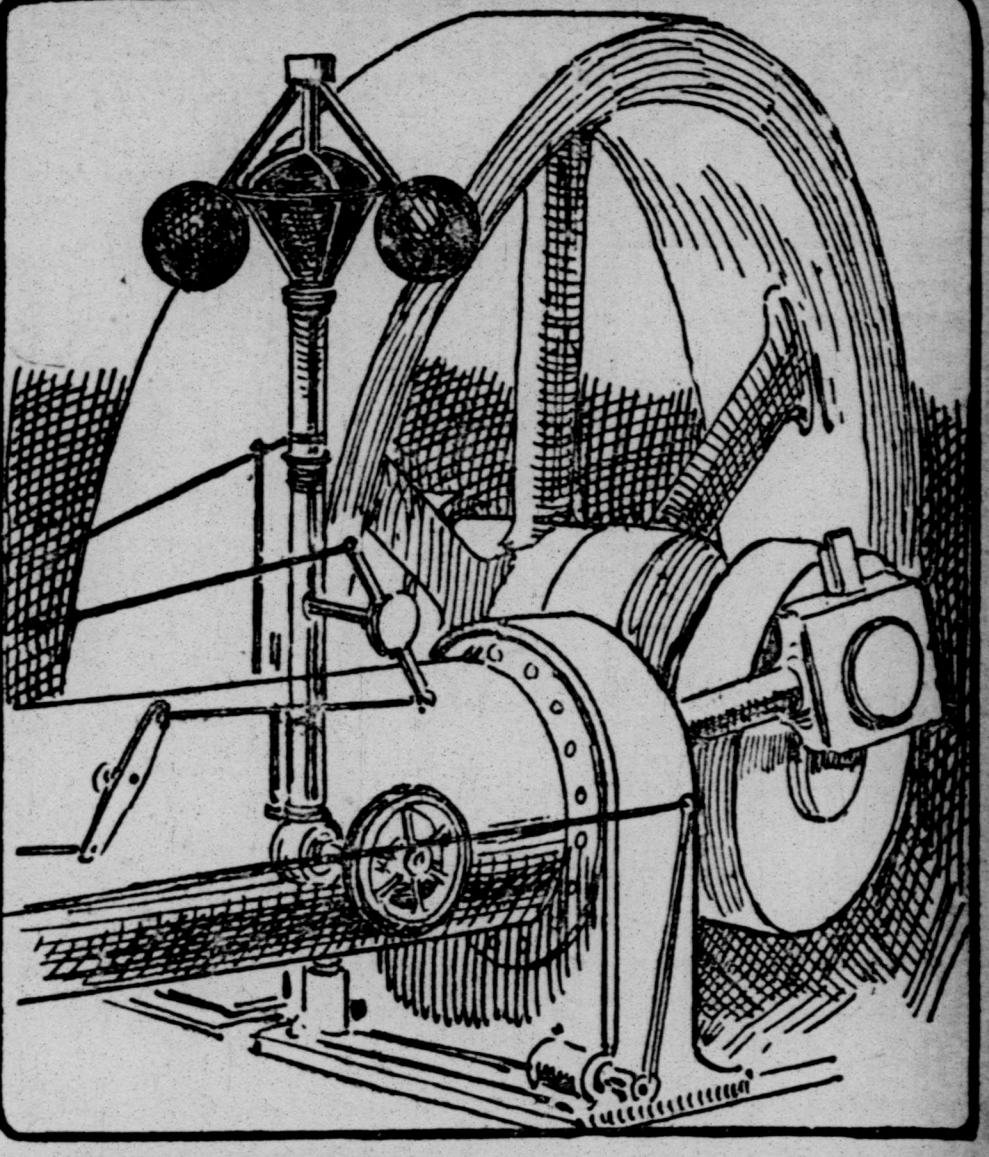
As an author Jones attracted attention with his works, "The New Right" and "Letters of Labor Love."

**ELECTION RETURNS RECEIVED FROM ALL BOXES**  
Ramsey Wins for County Superintendent by a Margin of Forty Votes—Other Results Are Unchanged

With the securing of returns last night from the box at Montgomery, The Telegram now has complete, though unofficial, returns of the primary elections. The official returns which are being prepared by Secretary Calhoun of the committee still lack reports from several of the boxes.

The returns as received by The Telegram show that the county superintendent's race, in which there was the greatest uncertainty, has been won by George Ramsey, with a margin of only 40 votes. Ramsey's vote was 2,796 and that of Trimble 2,756.

Although the figures as obtained by The Telegram may vary slightly from the official figures when presented, they show accurately the results of the election. The vote for county superintendent, which was a close one, has been checked up with the official figures as far as received by Secretary
