Short Course In Swine Production Begins at Local School August 22

A swine short course for adult farmers will be held August 22-23 inclusive under the sponsorship of the Dimmitt High School Vocational Agriculture Department, according to Paul Hilburn, Superintendent and Jim Dowdy and J. O. Seale, teachers of vocational agriculture.

Mr. C. M. Laywell, swine specialist with the Vocational Agriculture Division of the Texas Education Agency and the Department of Animal Husbandry at Texas A&M College, will be the instructor in the course. He is quartered at Texas A&M College.

Mr. Laywell holds a B.S. degree in animal husbandry from Southwest Texas State. He assisted in the field of veterinary medicine at San Marcos and has had several years of ranching and on-the-farm experience. He has been an instructor in vocational agriculture and has acted as swine judge at livestock judging contests.

"Many swine short courses in various parts of the state have been taught by Mr. Laywell and all have met with outstanding success," according to Walter LeBay, area supervisor of vocational agriculture of Plainview. Arrangements for the adult education short course in swine husbandry and in other fields are made through Mr. Le Bay's office.

The short course at Dimmitt is scheduled to begin August 22 at 8:00 p.m. in the vocational agriculture building. Other meetings in the series of five will be held August 23, 24, 25 and 26. During the dates the short course is in progress, Mr. Laywell will be available to assist students with individual problems and to provide on-the-farm instruction, according to Mr. Dowdy.

Farmers interested in attending the short course should write or call the superintendent of schools, Mr. Hilburn, or the teacher of vocational agriculture, Mr. Dowdy. An entry fee of \$2.00 will be charged. Swine Husbandry Short Course Certificates are to be presented to each student who attends all the training sessions.

Murry Brewer Leaves for Fort Worth Seminary

Rev. and Mrs. Murry Brewer and their two children have left for Fort Worth where he will enroll in a Theological Seminary where he will continue his ministerial studies.

Rev. Brewer came to Dimmitt from Kress in 1957 and took over the pastorate of the struggling Bethel Mission of the First Baptist Church. He operated an earth moving company until last year when the church began to require all of his time. When he arrived here after being an assistant pastor in Kress, Rev. Brewer began building up a congregation of less than 25 to one that numbered 229 when he left. The church was first renamed the Lee Street Baptist Church after the congregation joined the Southern Baptist Convention as an independent church. Later a site was selected on Lee Street and a new brick building was built, replacing the former surplus barracks building church. Several months ago the Brewers moved into a new parsonage purchased by the church, which has now grown into one of the largest in Dimmitt.

Rev. and Mrs. Brewer have two children, Ricky, 12 and Larry, 7. Rev. Brewer received a bachelor of arts degree from Wayland College last year.

A new pastor has not been selected to take his place.

Hearing Monday at Court House On Control of Weed Spraying

An open hearing by the Commissioners Court Monday will give Castro County farmers an opportunity to express their views on whether the state herbicide law should be enforced here.

The hearing arose after the court and county agent had heard many protestations of the use of herbicides over the county.

To invoke the law means that a farmer applying herbicides to weeds on his farm must first travel to Lubbock to secure a permit, paying 10 cents an acre for it. After spraying the chemical, he must then fill out a report containing such items as exact location where the spraying took place, wind direction and velocity, humidity, temperature, type of spray

and exact time of application. Purpose of the permit is to give any neighboring farmer suffering damage to his crops a record of applications in his area.

The law is administered by the Texas Department of Agriculture. It was passed to regulate spraying noxious weeds with sprays that would harm nearby desirable plants. Many farmers in the county have used this type of spray and some of their neighbors have declared that the spray drifted and damaged their cotton crops. These sprays are actually growth stimulants which forces the plant to "grow itself to death." There are arguments that the spray both does and does not drift. Some maintain that water will revive some sprays, causing them to drift days after application.

But whether it does or does not drift, or whether different base poisons drift in varying proportions from nozzle to nozzle, these will be a meeting to decide whether their application should or should not be controlled by the state.

The hearing will be conducted by the Commissioners Court in the courthouse at 10 a.m. If the farmers attending want the control it will be available and weed spraying will become difficult and exacting. If they express a desire against the regulation it is assumed the law will not be brought into the county.

The law will be fully explained at the meeting by a representative of the Texas Department of Agriculture. All the rules and regulations of the Department will also be covered.

Former Castro County Sheriff Makes Last Trip to Reunion

This year's homecoming was probably the last for former Castro County Sheriff John Flannigan, 81.

In failing health, Mr. Flannigan, does not believe he will be able to make another trip out here from his home in Fort Worth.

He arrived here last week several days before the homecoming and visited with many of his friends in this area who knew him as a pioneer sheriff, business man and rancher in his younger days.

Mr. Flannigan was a versatile man. He came to Dimmitt in 1898 at the age of 18 years and attended Nazareth School, studying under Mrs. Dora McDonald and her son, Bryan McDonald, now of Canyon. At the age of 21, Mr. Flannigan was elected the county's first surveyor and he served for six years in this office. Many of the original surveys in the county were by Mr. Flannigan.

Tiring of the surveying job, Mr. Flannigan ran for county sheriff and tax collector and won. He held the job for two terms and did not ask for a third. He ran again in 1930 and held the job for two more terms, having been elected by a large majority.

In addition to his interest in county politics, Mr. Flannigan operated a ranch near Sunnyside

D. C. Lawrence Accepts Post as Ralls Minister

D. C. Lawrence, for the past five years minister of the Church of Christ in Dimmitt, moved Thursday to Ralls where he will have a similar position with the Church of Christ there.

This is the second time he and his family have left Dimmitt. The first time was in December of 1948 when he finished up another five-year tenure of duty here. "I feel like Dimmitt is my home," Lawrence said Thursday, "since we have spent so much time here and our two boys, Danny, 14, and Johnny, 13, were born here." The Lawrences also have a daughter, Sue, 17.

Lawrence has spent more than half of his career as minister in Dimmitt. Counting the total of ten years during his two times to serve in Dimmitt, he has spent more time in Dimmitt than any other minister of any church here. He is working toward a master's degree from Eastern New Mexico University in Portales, and his thesis is a history of the Church of Christ, the Methodist Church, the Baptist Church and the Presbyterian Church in Dimmitt. During his latter stay in Dimmitt the church has added an educational wing to the building and purchased additional adjacent property. He has also had 295 responses to Gospel invitations during his last period of service in Dimmitt. He has preached at Kellerville, Borger and Lefors, all in the Texas Panhandle.

New minister of the church is M. B. McKinney of Friona, who will preach his first sermon here Sunday week.

Annual Castro County Farm Tour In Easter Community August 24th

The annual Soil Conservation and Crop Tour, sponsored by the Running Water Soil Conservation District and the County Extension Service, will be held Wednesday, August 24th.

Last Hospital Bills Paid By Red Cross For Tornado Victims

Castro County Hospital this week received two checks from the American Red Cross to pay the final installments on hospital bills persons were unable to pay who were involved in the Sunnyside tornado earlier this year.

Total cost of Castro County Hospital services came to \$6,200 and \$2,000 of this was paid by the individuals being treated. The balance of \$4,200 was paid by the two Red Cross checks.

The Red Cross also paid out thousands more to reimburse and reimburse the victims of the tornado. The national organization also sent three shifts of nurses who worked for a while and provided around-the-clock nursing care for one patient for a week.

There's a one to five chance your youngster needs a major teeth straightening job, since an estimated one-fifth of the nation's children suffer from "malocclusion," or improper alignment of the teeth.

What causes teeth to erupt irregularly? Dentists agree that heredity is probably one important cause. Another is persistent thumb-sucking and abnormal pressures against the jaw.

Another cause of malocclusion is prolonged retention of baby teeth. Permanent teeth which follow are then prevented from arriving themselves properly.

On the other hand, when primary teeth are lost too early, adjoining teeth may tend to tip and "migrate," crowding into spaces where permanent teeth should erupt.

There are different methods of bringing teeth into proper alignment. Sometimes it may be necessary to extract teeth to make room. In some cases a plastic or wire appliance may be fitted to the teeth to guide them into position by pressure.
