#### IMPROVES EQUIPMENT OF CLEANING DEPARTMENT

B. W. Shipley, proprietor of the De Luxe Cleaners, this week completed installation of new and modern equipment in his cleaning department. The new device is known as the 'continuous flow" system of naphtha cleaning. By this is meant that while clothing is in the automatic cleaner, the cleansing fluid (naphtha) is flowing continuously by means of a centrifugal pump. The dirty fluid is pumped out and the clean pumped in all the time clothes are in the machine.

"This new equipment which has been installed at considerable expense, will enable us to do our cleaning faster, and to guarantee our customers better service," Mr. Shipley said.




