

Dimmitt and Castro County began this week digging out of a 24-inch layer of snow which fell from last Wednesday intermittently until Sunday. This record snow is due to be followed by an additional four to five inches according to Amarillo weathermen.

The heavy snow late last week brought all business and movement to a virtual standstill until snowplows cleared the roads early this week. City, county, state highway department and local implement company employees worked at keeping the snow off roads during the storm but in many instances were not able to stay ahead of precipitation.




