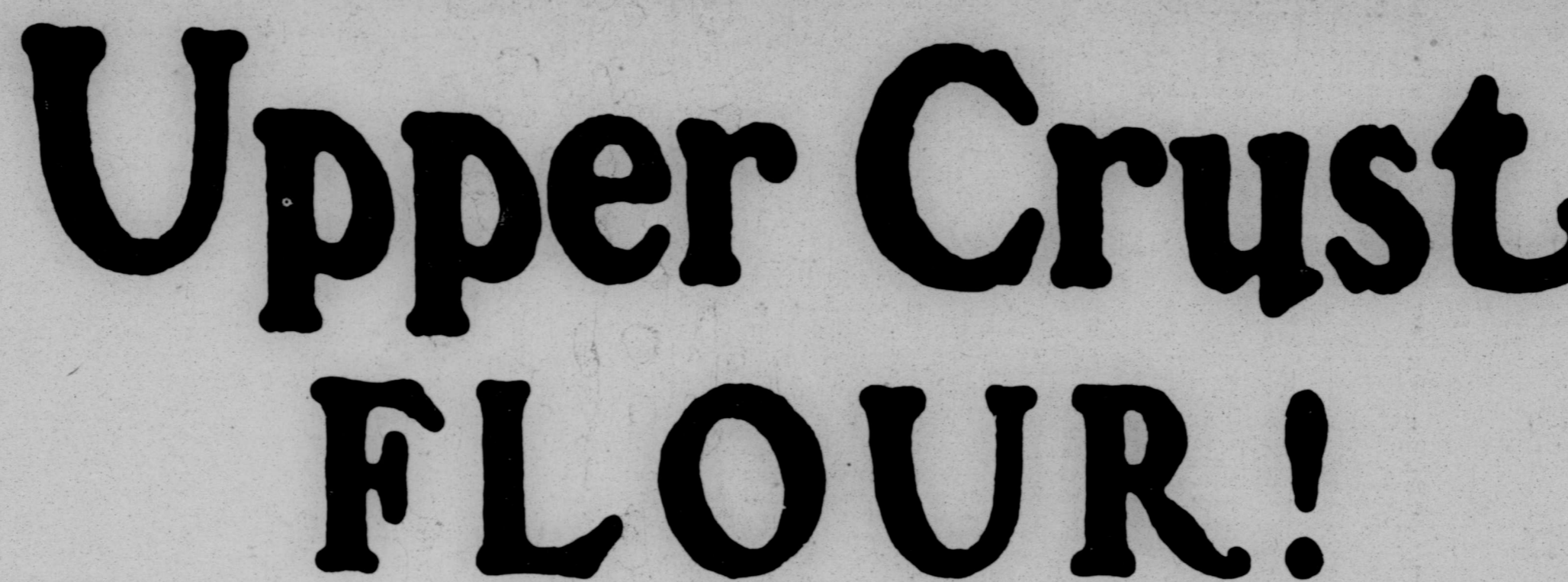

CITIZENS DISCUSS FRANCHISE GRANTS

Change in Charter Urged by People Generally

VESTED RIGHTS GIVEN City Declared Powerless to Amend Ordinances Granting Away Privileges

Amendment of the city charter to throw safeguards about the referendum, as suggested in the Telegram, endorsed by Mayor Powell and urged by leading citizens, is now being discussed upon all sides.

Speaking in this connection, Frank B. Stanley gave this as his opinion: "After a man or company has once been granted a franchise by the city, it becomes a right vested in the grantee, and if it builds its line on the faith of that grant, no subsequent repeal of the ordinance can destroy that right."

Other expressions made are: Alderman Satisfied B. L. Waggoner, alderman from the Second ward: "The people wanted the referendum; they agitated it; they got it, and they are certainly welcome to it."
