# **Jones Conviction** Upheld By Court

The court of criminal appeals Wednesday affirmed conviction and death sentence of W. Fred Jones for the Floydada shotgun slaying of H. C. Love

Love, a c'erk in Jones' grocery store, was killed Sept. 27, 1946.

The appeal from Crosby county was from Jones' second conviction and death sentence for the slaving. The firs' conviction, in Hale county, was reversed and a new trial ordered by the appeal court.

The appeal court's written opinion said that the state "evidently convinced the jury" of "falsity" of Jones' defense "and also of the maliciousness

# City Lets Water **And Sewer Work Contract Tuesday**

The City Council let a contract Tuesday of this week for water and sewer extensions as voted for in the recent bond election. The contract was awarded to Sidney E. Lanier of Haskell for \$56.587. The engineer's estimate for the job was \$71,000, Mayor G. M. Brunnier said.

Lanier's bid was the lowest one offered, with other bids ranging from \$59,111.50 to \$74,749.30. The bond is sue set up for present use was \$65,-

Plans and specifications were prepared by Harry N. Roberts, Lubbock consulting engineer, who will also supervise construction

The plans call for about 10,000 feet of sewer line, both new and replace ment, and about 30,000 feet of water line, also new and replacement. Some of the replacement work will be taktig down 6 inch lines, it was said.

Officials did not designate the exact locations of the extensions but made in almost every part of town.

COLLEGE STATION-If you can't drop an egg into the frying pan without breaking the yolk, perhaps you aren't storing the eggs correctly in the refrigerator.

There's a right and wrong way to store eggs in the refrigerator. And the right way, Myrtle Murray, extension home marketing specialist of Texas A. &. M. College, says is standing on the small end with the large end up.

Austin-Land Commissioner, Basom Giles, has found a 'steady custoner' for a small tract of school land in Pecos County

The Commissioner has received payment from an oil company covering rental on the tract for the next one hundred years, making the pre sent lease effective until the year

The tract, less than two acres in size, is one of the smallest in the School Land Board's records. However, it has paid off in man-sized hunks-\$20,000.00 to the Permanent School Fund in cash bonuses and \$217,-

The 100-year rental payment is without precedent, Giles stated.



### FIRST AID to the **AILING HOUSE** by Roger C. Whitman

QUESTION: "My bedroom has two doors with opposite faults; when unlatched, one will not stay open, the other will not stay closed. Can this be corrected by adjustment of hinges? Is it something an amateur can do."

ANSWER: The trouble in both cases is because the pin of the lower hinge is not directly in line with that of the upper hinge. To check on this, use a plumb linethat is, a string with a small weight tied to one end. If you hold the loose end of this at the bottom of the upper hinge pin, the weight will show you which hinge needs resetting. The door originally was set with the hinges in line, and the trouble has come because of settlement that has somewhat distorted the door frame. It may be that moving one hinge will be enough although possibly a small adjustment of both hinges will be easier.

When you have decided what to do, open the door part way, and jam books or blocks under the outer corner to take the weight. You then can remove the hinge pin of the hinge that is to be shifted, and do whatever is necessary. Take off the hinge plate on the door frame, and pack the screw holes with wood putty. You might find it necessary to place a shim (in the form of a piece of cardboard or a thin piece of wood) under the offending hinge.


