"AGAINST the Amendment to the Constitution of the State of Texas providing that the Legislature may provide for trials without a jury in lunacy cases." Each voter shall scratch out one (1) of said clauses on the ballot leaving the one (1) expressing his vote on the proposed Amendment. In counties or other subdivisions using voting machines, the above provision for voting for and against this Constitutional Amendment shall be placed or said machine in such a manner that each voter shall vote on such machine for or against the Constitutional Amend-

Sec. 3. That the Governor of the State of Texas issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and Laws of this State.

proposing an Amendment to Article V. Section 7 of the Constitution of the State of Texas to provide that the Judge of the District Court shall conduct its proceedings at the county seat of the county in which the case is pending, except as otherwise provided by law; providing for election proclamation and submission to qualified electors of the State

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS.

Section 1. That Section 7 of Article V of the Constitution of the State of Texas be amended so as hereafter to read as follows:

"Sec. 7. The State shall be divided into as many judicial districts as may now or hereafter be pro vided by law, which may be in creased or diminished by law. For each district there shall be elected by the qualified voters thereof, a a General Election, a Judge, wh four (4) years next preceding preceding his election, who shall term of office, who shall hold hi years, and shall receive for services an annual salary to be Court shall conduct its proceedings at the county seat of the county in which the case is except as otherwise provided by law. hold the regular terms of his Court at the County Seat of each County in his district at least twice in each year in such manner as may be prescribed by law. The Legis lature shall have power by General or Special Laws to make such provisions concerning the terms or sessions of each Court as it may

"The Legislature shall also provide for the holding of District Court when the Judge thereof is absent, or is from any cause dis abled or disqualified from presid-

"The District Judges who may be in office when this Amendment takes effect shall hold their offices until their respective terms shall expire under their present election

Sec. 2. The foregoing Constitutional Amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this State at an election to be held on September 24, 1949, at which time all ballots shall have printed thereon

"FOR the Constitutional Amendment providing that the District Court shall conduct its proceedings at the county seat of the county in which the case is pending, except as otherwise provided by law"

Sec. 3. The Governor shall issue the necessary proclamation for said election and have the same published as required by the Constitution and Laws of this State.
