For Southwest Texas, the agrito sometimes called algerita, is suitable. It is a hardy evergreen barberry, Bird-of-paradise, known by its yellow and red flowers with long stamens, thrives in this area, also. Purple dalea, Apache plums, Texas persimmon or black persimmon, rock bush or thornless catclaw. Chinese and Burford varieties of holly, Mrs. Henry Sammann and Mrs. and many kinds of privets grow successfully in the southwest. Wild lippia, nandina, evergreen sumac, desert yapupon and many kinds of yuccas are others


